

## From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,



This weekend's liturgy coincides with our annual celebration of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary in to Heaven, which is normally a Holy Day of Obligation. Recognized since the 6th century, this feast marks the "assumption" or "dormition" ("falling asleep") as it is called in the eastern churches. Although not Scriptural in its origins, we celebrate this moment when Mary came to end of her earthly life and was welcomed, body and soul, into Heaven. It is the logical conclusion of the life of she who was conceived without sin nor did she personally sin during her lifetime. In many ways, it is what ought to have been the final moments of every one of us, had sin and death not been part of our world and experience.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us, "Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death." (from paragraph #966). There had been debate in the early Church as to whether Mary died first and then was assumed, or whether she was taken up to Heaven before experiencing death.

Paragraph #966 continues, "The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians: In giving birth you kept your virginity; in your Dormition you did not leave the world, O Mother of God, but were joined to the source of Life. You conceived the living God and, by your prayers, will deliver our souls from death." Thus this feast is a celebration of Mary's faithfulness to God and God's faithfulness to Mary. By extension, it also celebrates our hope through Christ, to be joined with Mary and all of the Saints in the Heavenly Kingdom.

From an alternative text for the Collect:

Father in heaven,  
all creation rightly gives you praise  
for all life and all holiness come from you.  
In the plan of Your wisdom  
she who bore the Christ in her womb  
was raised body and soul in glory  
to be with Him in heaven.  
May we follow her example  
in reflecting your holiness  
and join in her hymn of endless life and praise.  
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

May this celebration lead us ever closer to one day joining with Mary and all of the Saints in God's Eternal Kingdom.

### Holy Communion in the Hand

Although many COVID-related restrictions at Mass have been lifted, one thing we are still being asked to do by the Archdiocese is to *receive Holy Communion only in the hand*. When Holy Communion is received on the tongue, it is very likely that the communicant will breathe on the hands of the priest or minister. It is very possible that small droplets of saliva or mucus from the mouth or lungs (which could contain COVID) could be transferred onto the hands of those distributing Communion and possibly passed on to others.

It is for this reason that those distributing Communion would be required to stop and sanitize their hands after every person whom they gave Communion to on the tongue. If we had to do this for everyone, the Communion procession would take an inordinate amount of time and become hopelessly cumbersome. So at this time everyone is being asked to only receive Communion in the hand. This is a temporary restriction that likely will be lifted in the months to come. Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we continue to recover from the pandemic.

## Mary, Our Mother

Each season of the year offers its own beauty: the ferocious, gentle promise of springtime; the blazing, brilliant heat of summer, the riotous color and bounty of autumn; the quiet, wondrous dark of winter. In each of these seasons, there is joy to be found, sorrow to be endured, times of trouble and times of relaxation, and each of these seasons brings to mind the life of the Holy Virgin: the child conceived without sin, the girl who said “yes,” the mother whose heart endured the torture and death of her only Son for the sake of a broken world, the Queen of heaven who bends the ear of God himself for those who seek her intercession.

Late in the fall, we celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, when St. Anne conceived the child Mary. Mary is unique among human beings because she was from her very creation without sin. Only her Son, who is both fully human and fully divine, was also born free from sin. Why is it important that Mary was thus conceived? She was to carry God himself within her. It is the same reason we seek to be in a state of Grace when we receive Him through the Eucharist.

As the summer rounds its final bend on August 15, we celebrate the *Feast of the Assumption*. As Catholics, we believe that Mary died at the end of a natural life and that her body and soul were brought to heaven. In this, Mary is a model of what we all hope for: “the resurrection of the body and life ever after.”

This reverence for Mary originates with Jesus Himself. Christ maintained intimate friendships with women throughout His life and ministry. In first-century Palestine, women had little social or legal standing. They were, essentially, permanent children in the eyes of the powerful men around them, but Jesus loved and respected women, especially His mother. It was at her prompting—her blessing—that He began His ministry at the wedding at Cana. This event also demonstrates Christ’s desire for his Mother to intercede, turning the water she had ordered into not just any wine, but the finest—her requests bear the best fruit.

Mary is our ultimate intercessor. Over and over, we are told that Her Son will not deny her. By appealing to Jesus’ mother, we are asking God’s own beloved to make our case. As Christians, we are called always to say “yes” to Christ, to trust that He has our best interests at heart, to trust that He will never abandon us.

Mary is our model for trust. Her *fiat* gives us the strength to say yes in ways both big and small: yes to praying for our enemies, yes to forgiving transgressors, yes to sharing our faith with our friends, family, and neighbors. Simeon told the young mother, holding her perfect, precious infant, “you yourself a sword will pierce,” and still she said yes (Luke 2:35).

So where does spring fit into the life of Mary? Everywhere that we see life bursting forth, flowers blooming, and the renewal of warmth and gentleness and beauty, we see Our Mother.

Mary, Mother of God, pray for us!

### The Not-So-Wonderful World of Invasive Plants

*Laudato Si Series*

**When:** Thursday, August 19, 7:00 p.m.

**Where:** Immaculate Conception St. Louis Hall in Newburyport

**Speaker:** Randall Prostak, University of Massachusetts Extension Specialist



Our third presentation of the Laudato Si series will explore the “not-so-wonderful world” of invasive plants. Discussion will focus on what makes a plant invasive in Massachusetts, why are we concerned, what has been done on the state level and considerations for invasive plant management. An overview of some of Massachusetts’ most invasive plants will be presented.

#### Speaker Bio

Randy Prostak joined UMass in 1994 and has been a UMass Extension Specialist since 2000 where he specializes in weed management. He is a member of the UMass Extension Landscape, Nursery, and Urban Forestry Team and is an active contributor to the Crop Dairy Livestock Equine, Turf, and Pesticide Education Extension programs. He currently serves on the Massachusetts Invasive Plant Advisory Group. Randy is an active member of the Weed Science Society of America and served as president of the Northeastern Weed Science Society. In February 2013, Randy received the Northeastern Weed Science Society’s Outstanding Educator Award. The 2021 growing season will mark Randy’s 23rd year working in weed science.

#### About the Laudato Si Series

The Laudato Si Series at HRIC Collaborative brings our community together in hope, faith, and action through a series of inspiring conversations led by local experts and projects all rooted in Pope Francis’ second encyclical *Laudato Si On Care for our Common Home*. ### Centering Prayer/Lectio Divina

We welcome all members of our Collaborative community to join us each Wednesday 6:00–7:00 p.m. via Zoom for 30 minutes of Centering Prayer, silently resting in God and surrendering and assenting to God’s presence and action in our lives. This ancient prayer practice opens our minds and hearts to hear God’s words as we continue by reading Sacred Scripture in group Lectio Divina.

For the next 30 minutes we listen to God’s words, ponder and share what we hear the Lord saying to us here and now, and contemplate God’s message to us and let it guide our choices and actions. 
