

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

This past weekend, our Collaborative Pastoral Council met for the first time this fall to begin our new work for the coming year. I want to express my gratitude to Jim Williamson for serving as Vice-Chair these past two years as



well as to Ann Jaroncyk for being the recording secretary. In an election at the beginning of our meeting, Chris Bergin was selected to be our new Vice-Chair for this coming year and Rich Ryan stepped forward to become our new secretary. Thank you to all for your past and future service!

These past few years, I have relied on the advice and counsel of the Pastoral Council more than ever in shaping our response to the pandemic and making many critical decisions that have enabled us to move forward through these uncertain times. Although we have had certain guidance from the Archdiocese and Commonwealth, many local decisions were left to Pastors to decide for their local faith communities. These are never decisions that one wants to make in a vacuum, so I am most grateful to everyone for their input and advice.

As part of our latest meeting, one of the topics that we discussed was the lifting of remaining COVID restrictions within our worship services. Absent any further directives from the Archdiocese or state, it was strongly felt that it was the right time to return to many of our pre-pandemic practices. While some things like a return to sharing in Communion Cup are regulated by the Archdiocese, most other practices can return to what was known as normal.

In the weeks ahead, we will be making extra efforts to recruit new parishioners to serve in various ministries within the liturgy — including Altar Servers, Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Greeters. While face masks are no longer required for anyone attending Mass, I want to support those who wish to wear a mask for their own protection. Hand sanitizer will continue to be made available to all parishioners, and I encourage everyone to use it liberally whenever you feel the need. Additionally, even with cooler weather approaching, we will continue to attend to proper ventilation within our churches. Although we will be removing the remaining roping that once separated certain pews for social distancing, I would encourage people to take advantage of the large variety of seating options that exist within our churches, especially at Immaculate Conception. It is usually easy enough to find a less-populated corner or side of the church for those

One of the actions we hope to return to our liturgies soon is the Offertory Collection taken up by the passing of a basket. 
Collaborative Choir Concert


