



From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

I have always had a love-hate relationship with the dawn. Sometimes craving more sleep, especially if it had been a late night before, or if I was called out on some emergency... getting just a few extra winks of sleep



can seem like the most important thing in the world. On the other hand, most of the time when I do rouse myself out of bed, I am filled with joy and the hope of a new day...or at least, I am looking forward to that first cup of coffee! It is strange how the aroma of freshly-brewed java can send endorphins surging through our minds and bodies in such a wonderful and predictable way! God bless whoever invented coffee!

The transition from darkness to light has had a profound impact on the human soul from the very beginning of creation. Long before electric lights became a reality, the return of daylight promised vision, clarity, safety, and opportunity for our ancestors and is no less true today. Despite advances in automotive headlight technology, who would rather drive at night if you could make the same trip during the day when you could see better?

The dawn promises the ability to be about our human enterprise—to work, to school, to the marketplace and more. Although human activity can occur at any time of the day or night, there is a tremendous surge in business once the sun begins to come up. It provides the opportunity for us to use this time for our profit and betterment. Or not. The choice is up to us!

It is in this same notion that our new season of Advent reminds us that dawn is approaching in our relationship with the Lord. Just as in terrestrial matters we have choices to make, so too, in celestial and eternal things, we are called upon to embrace this coming light as a moment to re-orient ourselves towards God.

As Catholic Christians we believe in the Second Coming of Christ—that Christ will return and gather us to Himself in a great day of judgement. The Scriptures are very clear that no one, not even Christ Himself, but only the Father knows when this will happen. It could be tomorrow afternoon or a million years from now. Nobody knows. And if anyone pretends to know, the Scriptures are also very clear: do not follow them! But the day will come at a time when no one expects it and will catch many off guard, just as despite many warnings to the contrary, people ignored Noah's plea to repent and prepare for a great flood.

So Advent exists to remind us, once again, of our need to get ready to welcome the Lord when He does actually come. We do this in two important ways. First, by examining our lives and "tidying up a bit" where we see sin and its effects. Advent is a time to look with the clarity of daylight at how we are living out our relationships with God and others. If Christ were to come today, what would need to change for that to be a positive experience? Where are the "spiritual dust bunnies" that I have been sweeping under the proverbial carpet in months or years past? Honestly, if any one of us were to come face-to-face with the Lord today, what might He demand that change?

Secondly, Advent is a time set aside to help us properly prepare for the celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas. For us Christians, it has very little to do with decorating and baking, wrapping paper and tinsel. Rather, the Church invites us to prayerfully ponder the Scriptures that first prepared our hearts to welcome Him two millennia ago. It is about soaking in the words of Isaiah: "Come, let us climb the LORD's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that He may instruct us in His ways, and we may walk in His paths." (Is 2:3). It is about patiently waiting in hope for the saving help of the Lord. It is about anticipating all that the promised Christ would fulfill. It is about the expectant joy of knowing that God is about to bless us richly and letting our minds and hearts wander and dream about all that might entail.

To that end, I would warmly invite you and your family to make it a point to keep Advent a sacred season in your home. Buy or make an Advent Wreath and pray the daily prayers that ignite this great hope of Christ. Any four candles will do, any set of greens will suffice. The prayers are available online as are the Scripture readings for the day. Keep it prayerful, keep it simple! Get or make an Advent calendar and count down the days until Christmas. (BTWrumor has it that SOME Advent calendars even have things like chocolate behind each of the doors.... Now THAT is the way to get into the season!) Play seasonal music-no, not rocking around the you-know-what-tree, but how about: Part 1 of Handel's Messiah or many of the other classic Advent hymns that are available. "The Word is Born" by Francis Patrick O'Brien, George Winston's December, Marty Haugen's "Night of Silence," Candled Seasons by The University of Notre Dame Folk Choir and Music for Advent II by the Schola Cantorum of St. Peter's are just a few of my favorites and should be easily available for purchase, download, or streaming this week. If you really want to dive deep into our tradition, see if you can find Cypriot Advent Antiphons by Paul Van Nevel: Huelgas Ensemble. While not for the faint of heart, it will take you back to the 13th century in all of its Medieval Latin glory.

Most especially, I would urge you to use this time well. Christmas and all of the secular hoopla that goes with it can be fun and exhausting in equal measure, but Advent invites us to intentionally slow down and consider our place before God. With gift giving at the forefront of the commercial holiday extravaganza, Advent poses the question of what gift do we make of ourselves to God? What do we offer from our hearts to the poor and to those who are in need, realizing that some of the best gifts come from a sharing of our time and presence and are not necessarily found in a catalog. If Christ were to return to earth with all of the angels in glory before December 25, would He find us watching and ready to greet Him?

Every year, I pull out my favorite bumper sticker that is too precious for me to actually place on my car, but I share it with you here. It reads: "Jesus is coming... look busy!" Now that the dawn is upon us, may we be about many things of the Lord in the weeks ahead!

Before COVID, a safety committee was just forming to address many different aspects of our parish gatherings. One of the needs that was discussed was the placement of AED's or automated external defibrillators in our worship spaces and parish halls. Recently, we had a medical situation in one of our spaces where one of these devices might have been helpful prior to Emergency Medical Services arriving. Although we enjoy a very rapid response from the first responders in our area, it is time that we add these devices along with "stop-bleed" kits and updated first-aid kits to each of our gathering spaces.
