

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

In the days before the internet, GPS and navigation apps, I found myself attempting to drive across the country alone. At first, it was an exhilarating adventure—a real taste of freedom and the promise of an open road! Not



having any idea how far I would make it each day, I decided to take each day as it came. My destination was Chicago, but I had planned on stopping somewhere around Cleveland for the night. After several stops and multiple conversations with hotel clerks along the way, I discovered, much to my horror, that there was some major convention in town that had everything booked solid. "No vacancy" signs were everywhere. It was getting dark, and I reluctantly continued on the highway, hoping that I could find somewhere to spend the night rather than sleeping in my car or trying to drive straight through. On my official AAA paper map, I saw a reasonably large city called Elyria, just west of Cleveland that held some promise. I was getting tired, and it was approaching 10:00 p.m. that night, so it was Elyria or maybe sleep in a ditch somewhere.

To make matters worse, it had started to rain, making visibility all that much harder. I strained to read the passing highway signs, hoping against hope that I didn't somehow miss the one for Elyria along the way. Finally, through waves of raindrops and road mist, I saw it dimly reflected in the distance. They say your heart leaps when you glimpse the first sign of hope. For me, that night, it was an understatement! I nearly drove off the road I got so excited to be taking the exit to Elyria! That the glazed-over motel clerk at the Quality Inn was unimpressed with my pronunciation of her town's name, correcting me several times during the check-in process (BTW-it is pronounced eh-leer-ee-ah) did nothing to dampen my spirits. I had found a bed to sleep in for that night! All was right with the world, for that moment anyway. I will always remember how awesome it was to see that first sign for Elyria on that wet, dank night.

glimmer that what we seek is right around the corner, or that we are at least on the right path. We plant vegetables in the spring and then look expectantly to see the first shoots break the soil. We watch the weather carefully in the summer months, hoping that our perfect beach day will be filled with blessings. We mark the first frost in the fall, knowing that Thanksgiving and even greater festivities are quickly approaching. And in the midst of winter's ice and chill, we wait for warmer days, a return of the sunshine after the solstice, and the hopeful presence of songbirds to announce the coming vernal equinox. Our seasons produce definitive signs that predictable change is all around us. Reading these signs, just like charting the map of the stars above has been a reliable way to understand our place in the universe and to bring reassurance that hope is upon us.

Even more so than in the natural world, we have sought this same reassurance in our relationship with God. Promises and covenants were made by our ancestors of old with the eternal God of the universe, but we repeatedly wanted some sign here or there that we were still on the right track, or more honestly, how to get back on track when we had gone astray. For example, a rainbow was given in the sky as a sign that we no longer had to fear another flood when it rained, or a Seder meal was celebrated to recall our deliverance from slavery in Egypt. Out of His great love and patience, God sent the prophets to us again and again to remind us of His Covenant and call us to holiness. Most of the time these were needed wake up calls to turn away from sin or to remember His commandments. But every once in awhile God, just because He is God, decided to do something new! And so through Isaiah, He invited Ahaz to ask for a sign. When he refused to engage God's free offer, God decided to give a sign anyway—that the virgin will give birth to a child and they shall call Him Emmanuel.

A virgin-birth! What a powerful, yet also subtle sign that God is doing something extraordinary! Surely the child to be born will be destined for greatness! Coming into the world in an unheard of way, this child must be sent by God to accomplish a special purpose that would later be revealed. The child would be a sign of a new beginning by God, a new expression of God's awesomeness for us to behold. That St. Joseph might have needed a little sign from God through a dream that all was going to be OK is understandable, from a human perspective.

So also this sign given to us this Fourth Sunday of Advent, as we anticipate the coming celebrations of Christmas next weekend. It is a sign of fulfillment and wholeness. Do we not long for God to do something new? Do we not pine for relief from our burdens? Do we not crave One who could satisfy our deepest longings? Do we not look with expectation for One who can heal our broken hearts, wipe away our tears, soothe our wounded souls? Do we not bristle with excitement of the prospect of finally encountering One who could truly heal us and make us whole?

Brighter than a glistening street sign on a rainy night, Emmanuel is THE sign that God loves us and still calls us today to hope in the bright promise of mercy, forgiveness and joy. Follow this sign to new life and God will bless us beyond our wildest imaginations! Let us rest in His peace, confident in the unmerited gift of His love to us this Christmas.

Increase the Deductibility of Your Charitable Giving

People reaching 70½ years old must begin taking withdrawals from their individual retirement accounts (IRAs) under the rule for "required minimum distributions" or RMDs. Of course, the distribution means paying taxes on the withdrawn amount.

The Tax Cut and Jobs Act increased the standard deduction. Many individuals who itemized in the past may find that taking the now-higher standard deduction is a better federal tax strategy.

When you take the standard deduction, there is a strict limitation on what you can also deduct for charitable giving. But there is a way for some seniors to still get an increased deduction for their giving, thereby reducing their taxable income even if they don't itemize.

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) can satisfy all or part of the amount of your required minimum distribution from your IRA. If you directly transfer funds from the IRA to a qualified charity, those dollars count toward the RMD for the year, but are not counted as income. You can effectively claim a tax deduction for increased charitable giving without itemizing deductions.

Be aware that a QCD is available only to IRA owners 70½ years or older. And the maximum annual exclusion for QCDs is \$100,000. If you file a joint return, your spouse also can have a QCD and exclude up to \$100,000. For more details read IRS 590-B "Distributions from Individual Retirement Arrangements (IRAs)." Always check with your financial advisor or tax preparer before making tax or financial decisions.

IC Haiti Collection and Recent Fundraisers

The final collection of 2022 for Haiti is the weekend of December 17–18. Please be generous!

Since 2008, our Collaborative and other concerned donors have responded to the needs of the Haitian people, particularly those living in the community of Puit Chacha on the southern peninsula. Despite the chaotic humanitarian crisis that is now afflicting Haiti, the Father Marc Piché Elementary school still operates daily providing students with a safe learning environment, a nutritious hot lunch program, regular dental care, and access to healthcare.

However, as the crisis continues, supplies (including food and fuel) dwindle, access to markets is denied, costs soar, and people suffer. We, thanks be to God, remain committed to our brothers and sisters in Haiti, especially to the school community in Puit Chacha.

Just in the past five years, IC Haiti's annual operating cost has averaged close to \$77,000. These costs include the entire school's budget and emergency medical response efforts related to hurricanes, earthquakes, and disease. The current crisis will certainly push costs up even higher in the coming year.

Because of this, the IC Haiti Board of Directors is cognizant of its responsibility to double our efforts to make a greater effort at fundraising. Most recently, Merrimac Heights Academy held a Walk for Water fundraiser for IC Haiti where students and staff raised \$3,000, and the IC Haiti Board held a fundraiser at the Newburyport Brewery which raised \$3,541. We are thankful to all who contributed to these fundraisers, but we will have to do more to meet our expected expenses.

We are most grateful to you, the parishioners of both Holy Redeemer and Immaculate Conception, and we continue to count on your generosity during the quarterly second collections. For your information, Board members are not compensated, and administrative costs are less than 1% of the moneys we receive. You can be assured your donations are going directly to meet the needs of the people we have been called to serve in Haiti.


