

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

One of my favorite movies of all time is the 1983 film, A Christmas Story. On the surface, it can seem to have almost nothing to do with any religious understanding of the holiday, save for one fleeting scene of Black Gospel



carolers crowding around an oil-drum fire for warmth. "Go Tell It On The Mountain" quickly gets drowned out by rampant commercialism and the secular bacchanalia that has suffocated this precious feast for many decades. The movie, for the un-initiated, is set in or around December of 1940 and is all about a little boy named "Ralphie" who pines for an "official Red Ryder, carbine action, 200-shot, range model air rifle, with a compass in the stock..." for Christmas, as the oft-repeated line goes. Filled with a gentle reminiscent narrative by his present-day self, Ralphie's foibles of trying to suggest his prized object of desire to his parents, teacher, and even old St. Nick himself lead to all sorts of child-exaggerated drama that is lovingly told with humor and a healthy dose of nostalgia. All that makes for a heart-warming holiday movie that has stood the test of time and even won several awards, including being enshrined in the Library of Congress' National Film Registry. There is something in this movie for just about everyone—humor, imperfect but lovable characters, clever story-telling, and a healthy dose of Americana. Any kid who ever got pelted by a snowball or was forced to wear a snowsuit and couldn't lower their arms will certainly find some kinship here!

So, what does any of this have to do with Jesus, one might ask? Well, back out the overt commercialism, look beyond the innate secular setting for most of the film, and what you will find is a genuine human drama about longing, hope, and dreams fulfilled. At the very heart of the story of Christ's birth, is that not exactly what we celebrate this Christmas? Have we not longed and pined for a Savior, who could fulfill all of our deepest human needs? Have we

not looked, expectantly, for One who could right every wrong, heal every hurt, fix every mistake? Over the centuries, have we not sought to find and discover anew this promise-fulfilled each Christmas, when we celebrate God doing something unexpected and certainly undeserved?

Ralphie's passionate, if misguided, efforts to get his toy gun for Christmas echo the resilience of the human heart. Beyond any quest for material things, humanly, do we not seek the eternal? Saint Augustine once wrote in his Confessions, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." Recognizing that, we have a built-in homing beacon that seeks our Creator and won't rest until we have filled ourselves with Christ. There is a beautiful line at the end of the movie when Ralphie (spoiler alert!) is sleeping soundly with his newlyacquired Christmas gift, and his older-self narrates the moment as "all was right with the world," for that moment anyhow. Is that not what we seek permanently with God? For all things to be made right with each other and with our God? In Hebrew, the lofty word is "Shalom," meaning a kind and quality of peace that is based on profoundly rightrelationships.

For us Christians, Christ is that gift who brings peace beyond our wildest understanding of what that could be. Just as through our human misadventures, mistakes and multitude of wrong turns, the reception of this gift seems improbable if not downright impossible, at the end and without truly deserving any of it, Christ is given to us as a free and unmerited blessing. This is good news for us today as we mark His birth once again: for those who suffer will find relief. Those who have been sidelined by injustice or misunderstanding will find solid footing. Those who have been beaten down by prejudice and hatred will be vindicated and lifted up. Those who are victims of violence and war and famine will be fully restored. Those whose sins are as red as crimson will be washed as white as wool. Those who have born the great burden of trying to broker peace when all seem to be screaming for war will find satisfaction. Those who hunger and thirst for the very basic necessities to live in this world will find an abundance of rich, juicy food and tasty wine, as is alluded in Isaiah's vision (From Ch. 25). Those who simply want to be free to love as completely as their hearts dream will find a magnificence in Christ that goes well beyond what human speech could ever convey. Christ, truly, will make all things, all people, all places, and all times right with the world and with our God. He is the best, greatest, and the original Christmas present we have ever been given or ever will receive. We rejoice today and always at the awesomeness of this gift!

This Christmas, whether you are the recipient of a "major award," get invaded by the Bumpass' dogs or discover the joy of "Chinese turkey," I pray that you and your family may find an abundance of joy from receiving God's gift of pure love to us in Christ. May His Peace dwell richly in our hearts this day and always.

Increase the Deductibility of Your Charitable Giving

Below is some information that was shared with me that may be helpful to you. People reaching 70½ years old must begin taking withdrawals from their individual retirement accounts (IRAs) under the rule for "required minimum distributions" or RMDs. Of course, the distribution means paying taxes on the withdrawn amount.

The Tax Cut and Jobs Act increased the standard deduction. Many individuals who itemized in the past may find that taking the now-higher standard deduction is a better federal tax strategy.

When you take the standard deduction, there is a strict limitation on what you can also deduct for charitable giving. But there is a way for some seniors to still get an increased deduction for their giving, thereby reducing their taxable income even if they don't itemize.

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) can satisfy all or part of the amount of your required minimum distribution from your IRA.

If you directly transfer funds from the IRA to a qualified charity, those dollars count toward the RMD for the year, but are not counted as income. You can effectively claim a tax deduction for increased charitable giving without itemizing deductions.

Be aware that a QCD is available only to IRA owners 70½ years or older. And the maximum annual exclusion for QCDs is \$100,000. If you file a joint return, your spouse also can have a QCD and exclude up to \$100,000. For more details read IRS 590-B "Distributions from Individual Retirement Arrangements (IRAs)." Always check with your financial advisor or tax preparer before making tax or financial decisions.

AED and First Aid Kits

Recently, we had a medical situation in one of our spaces where one of these devices might have been helpful prior to Emergency Medical Services arriving. Although we enjoy a very rapid response from the first responders in our area, it is time that we add these devices along with "stop-bleed" kits and updated first-aid kits to each of our gathering spaces. 




