



From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Over the coming months, Catholics from around the world will be invited to participate in what is being called the Synod on Synodality.

What does that mean?

A "synod" is a council or church gathering, often led by the Pope or bishops and usually focused around



a particular topic or need within the Church or wider world. They can be worldwide gatherings or very local ones, involving only a single diocese and its people. Recent worldwide synods have been centered around such topics as "The Eucharist as the Source and Summit of the Life of the Church" (2005) and "The New Evangelization" (2012). Back in 1989, the Archdiocese of Boston held its Eighth General Synod, producing a rich offering of various pastoral guidelines and initiatives, many of which are still bearing fruit today.

This new Synod on "Synodality" is a worldwide event that hopes to address the very way that we dialogue with and listen to each other in the life of the Church. It is meant to encompass ecclesial conversations on every level from those that involve the Church's hierarchy as well as those centered on the parish level and everything in between. As a general guideline, it should be noted that this synod is about synodality itself. Its goal is not to discuss all of the issues in the Church, but rather to discuss how the Church listens to, and can listen better to, all her people and draws the voices of all into her prayer, her mission, and her decision-making process on every level. One could say that this is more about immersion into an art form than an exact science. Since on a human level there are so many variables and factors that affect how we hear and understand one another, when scaled up to include the whole Church in its fullness, this art of listening and dialogue can never be reduced to a mere formula for success nor dependent only on the finesse of those few who possess legendary diplomatic skills. Rather, it must be the product of the whole, inclusive of the full range of human experience and a healthy interplay of a diversity of opinions. "In this sense, synodality enables the entire People of God to walk forward together, listening to the Holy Spirit and the Word of God, to participate in the mission of the Church in the communion that Christ establishes between us." Here in the Archdiocese of Boston it means that we will be gathering, as parishes and as a diocese to pray together and to invite the Holy Spirit to help us to listen more deeply to one another, and we will talk together about how best to do that. So, for instance, a parish council may get together and ask "How can we as a parish council do a better job of letting the voices of all our parishioners be heard, even those who are not a part of an inner circle or who might be marginalized for whatever reason?" The Archdiocese and the Church

around the world will be engaging in the same sort of conversation.

At this time, I would like to invite you to participate on the local level in two ways:



Secondly, please join in on the conversation on our local level by attending a Zoom Meeting on Saturday March 5 at 1:30 p.m. or an in-person meeting on Sunday March 6 at 1:00 p.m. in St. Louis Hall on the IC Church campus. Those wishing to join the Zoom meeting can simply call our Collaborative office in advance to receive the proper electronic invitation. Listed below are some of the general Synod Questions that we are being asked to consider:

- 1. In our experience—within our parish or other community—who should have a voice? And who does in fact have a voice? How could we improve that? And how could the same thing happen in our Archdiocese and in the Church around the world?
 - a. How can the common person in our communities be better heard?
 - b. Who are the marginalized people in our communities, and how can they be better heard?



a. ... in our conversations?

b. ... in our families?

c. ... in our parishes or other local communities?

d. ... in our archdiocese?

e. ... in the global Church?

f. ... How could we do all of that better?

For a synodal Church 3. How does our prayer—both individual prayer and at Mass and other liturgical gatherings (communal

liturgy)—impact our ability to listen?

- 4. How connected do you feel to the core mission of the Church—making disciples for Jesus? Do you feel like you have been chosen for mission, equipped for that mission, and sent specifically out on that mission? In the course of that mission, do you feel like you have a group of fellow missionary disciples with whom to share your experiences? How could we improve that kind of interaction in the Church?
- 5. How does the Church (local/diocesan/global) support those who take part in her mission within the society and culture (parents, grandparents, educators, scientists, lawmakers, writers, artists, social workers, those who work with the poor, those who seek to protect the environment)? And how does she listen to them?
- 6. Listening often involves listening across borders. How well do the parishes or other local communities in your area work together and listen to one another? What is the involvement of various communities of religious men and women in your parish? Is there a dialogue with other faith communities who are not Catholic?
- 7. How could the decision-making process within your local community be improved? Is there room for a broader process? How can transparency be improved? Is prayerful discernment a part of the process?

I hope that you can join with me for one of these meetings and see where and how the Holy Spirit may guide our present and future conversations locally and beyond.

Personal Directed Lenten Retreat

The Season of Lent begins March 2. How will you accompany Jesus? Jesus calls us to "take up our daily cross and follow him" (Lk 9:23). How will you respond?

Once again, your usual Lenten practices may be impacted by restrictions or health concerns. Please consider a Personal Directed Lenten Retreat that reflects and supports your spiritual practices and your unique relationship with God for your Lenten journey.

As you prepare for Lent; what cross are you carrying, what unmet needs are you experiencing, what losses or trials are you suffering, what desires are you holding in your heart?

During the sacred season of Lent accompany Jesus as he carries his cross. Bring your cross, needs, suffering, and desires to Jesus as you ponder his own time of suffering and trial endured with perfect love and total trust in his loving father. A personal directed retreat may support and guide you to share deeply with Jesus his salvific suffering, know and accept his love and healing and express your love for him. Deepening love and trust in Jesus may strengthen you to take up your cross each day and follow him.

Retreat will open March 1 and close April 13. You may schedule direction sessions throughout Lent as desired and at your own pace. We will meet via telephone or Zoom on a day and time convenient for you. During the first session we will explore will your focus for Lent. I will provide related material for prayer and reflection and meet with you for four additional one-hour individual sessions of Spiritual Direction during Lent as we are led by the Holy Spirit.

Face Masks Required

The Archdiocese of Boston is requiring all people attending public Masses to wear a face mask for the duration of the service. Children under the age of 5 are not required to wear masks. Children under the age of 2 should not wear masks.

This applies to weekend Masses as well as Funerals, Weddings, Baptisms, and any indoor prayer services. This requirement will be in place **until at least March 3** (Thursday after Ash Wednesday). Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.




