From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

What is sometimes called, "The Parable of the Fig Tree" is a powerful reminder of the almost-infinite patience of our God. Not that any one of us has any business placing limits on God, but the parable itself hints that someday there will be a



moment when God says, "Enough is enough, cut it down!" But not yet. Even the most barren of plants are given a chance to grow and become everything they were meant to be before God. And that means producing fruit!

God takes such delight in His creation working the way it was meant to be—plants and tress producing fruit at the appropriate times . . . and we human beings producing acts of justice and righteousness at moments when they are called for and expected. And God is watching and earnestly looking for everything to work according to His plan. And when it doesn't, God will act so that others may come in their stead to take up the nutrients of the soil and perhaps bear the desired fruit.

In the Scriptures there is a dynamic tension between God's mercy and patience and God's steadfast passion for justice. On the one hand we have the testimony from Isaiah that God's Servant will not "quench the smoldering wick nor snap the bruised reed," (from Is 42:3) giving hope that God's patience will endure as long as there is even the tiniest possibility of new life. And yet at the same time we also encounter the mighty roar of the Lord relentless pursuit of righteousness . . . "His winnowing fork is in His hand, and He will thoroughly clear His threshing floor; and He will gather His wheat into the barn, but He will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire." (Mt 3:12)

So . . . Yes, we will take the time to fertilize. Yes, we will take the time to water. Yes, we will take the time to prune. Yes, we will take the time for these actions to have an effect and hopefully produce some fruit. But, there will come a time when God will say, "No more time, enough is enough. Cut it down." We are not yet at that time, but it will come.

Lent is an opportunity to do some fertilizing and watering and pruning while it may be of some benefit to us. That we may bear some fruit for the Lord. And what kind of fruit does God look to harvest from us? While the earthly Jesus was fond of figs when they were in season, what God looks for in each of us is a holiness of life, a hunger for justice, a passion for mercy, a generosity of forgiveness, a compassion towards those who suffer, a willingness to help



Lenten Guidelines

All Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence. Good Friday is a day of fastng and abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by anyone 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. (When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)

When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Fasting, prayer, and almsgiving are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

Due to varied schedules and availability, it may not always be possible for a priest to come on short notice to offer the Sacrament, therefore it is strongly recommended that you request the Anointing of the Sick *before* going in for a hospital stay, upon entering a nursing home, or at the beginning of hospice care. A longstanding tradition at Immaculate Conception School is the springtime Celebration of Learning. This year the middle school students will embrace 21st century skills through a STEM/STREAM project on a topic of personal interest. Topics students are

exploring include foods around the world, air pollution, the history of music, computer science, invasive ants, and ocean currents, to name a few.

Students first submitted a proposal and then began their research, brainstorming designs and sketching models for their final presentations. Presentations will be designed and constructed to reach the audience in the most effective manner, based on the topic. This will include a variety of platforms and technologies to present their work through 3D design and printing, video, audio, virtual reality, artwork, coding, and circuits, to name just a few.




