

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

In photography, there are many different lenses that can be used with cameras to achieve very dramatic results. Choose a zoom lens, for instance, and that which is in the far distance instantly becomes



close and many otherwise unseen details come in to sharp focus. Try a fish-eye lens, on the other hand, and everything in the world comes into view at the same time, even if it is badly distorted and circular. Engage a wideangle lens and a sweeping panoramic view broader than what the human eye can see in an instance is unveiled. On much more subtle scales, prime lenses with a fixed focal length can bring gentle nuances to portraits and draw delicate contrasts that zoom lenses cannot. Of course. each of these lenses have their downside as well. A zoom lens eliminates the foreground, a fish-eye lens throws proportion to the wind, a wide-angle lens eliminates distant details and prime lenses force the photographer to move to reframe a subject, rather than simply moving a dial on the lens. A good photographer knows the strengths and limits of each lens in their kit and deploys each to its maximum effect in telling a story through pictures. The results, of course, can be breathtaking in the hands of a true master.

I'd like you to consider the above as we move through Holy Week and encounter the various Scripture stories and Holy texts that tell of the most central mysteries of our faith. The Gospel writers and Sacred authors precisely invite us to consider various aspects of these most passionate events. Through their careful use of words and phrases, quotations and imagery, we are invited into the saving action of God, enfleshed and poured-out for our sake. Some events, like that which is recalled this weekend with the triumphant entry into Jerusalem are meant to be seen in a long continuity with the past, but read as a fulfillment in the present. The Lord's Crucifixion happened but once many centuries ago, but is made present and real for us today, that we might continue to benefit from its one, true sacrifice. We focus on the awful details of jealousy and betrayal, of hatred and unjust condemnation. We also encounter the subtleties of love and hope, of friendship and trust. Redemption is interwoven amidst pain and suffering.

One of the marks of a good camera and experienced photographer is the ability to highlight a subject by limiting the area of focus while casing the background into an intentional, gentle blur. This is called the "bokeh" effect and when well-done, makes for truly dramatic pictures that evoke deep emotion and profound interest. Although the background is blurred, it still surrounds the subject with color and context. Holy Week has much bokeh imbedded into the drama, that we might appreciate its central figure, Jesus Christ, all the more deeply. And just occasionally, a few otherwise incidental details are brought into sharp focus that give us treasured, poignant pericopes of the narrative that cling to our hearts and compel our continued journey of prayer: palm branches and processions, simple gifts of bread and wine offered and shared...a cruel crown

I think, I hope, what you will see that comes into view, in all of its richness, is a God who loves and saves. That's an image which will burn itself into our hearts now and for all eternity.

Lenten Guidelines

All Fridays during Lent are days of **abstinence**. **Good Friday** is a day of fasting and abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by anyone 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. (When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)

When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Fasting, prayer, and almsgiving are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.



Immaculate Conception School



A key component to the educational experience at Immaculate Conception School is cultivating "student voice." The IC utilizes several digital tools to foster student voice that range from quick one-click check-ins to assess student understanding to final presentations for long-

term projects. Seeking student responses in the classroom can be time consuming. Allowing time for everyone to share their ideas is not always possible, so having tools that capture all that a student wants to say is a valuable alternative. It can be enlightening to hear what a young student thinks or knows about a given subject—perspective that often reveals so much more than what a child is capable of sharing through the written word. Digital tools can also make class participation more comfortable for those who tend to shy away from raising their hand or need more thinking time to craft a response. Providing alternatives that make participation more comfortable for students is how student voice is cultivated at the IC.

IC recently held Art Crawl for school families. Works of art for students in grades 1-4 had a QR Code attached that linked parents to an audio of the child explaining their artwork. Using the digital platform SeeSaw, each student used their school Chromebook to take a picture of their art piece that hung in the hallway, clicked the "record" button and told the story of how they created the work of art. Then, our Tech Department uploaded each child's recording to create



a unique QR Code which accompanied the artwork on display. As parents toured the building enjoying the art, they put their iPhone on the picture-taking setting, hovered over the QR code, and hit the yellow button to hear the child's voice come through on their phone. A simple and easy digital tool that literally brought the artwork to life.

Our 8th graders recently conducted research on historical figures who were activists of their time. The final presentation involved making a podcast for the class to hear. This format enabled students to finesse their podcast to perfection and infuse music for dramatic effect, all while avoiding the discomfort that often accompanies giving a final presentation in front of the class.

Spanish class is a subject where students utilize digital tools frequently. By recording dialogue, the Spanish teacher is able to hear each child's pronunciation and give feedback to the student privately. The one-on-one feedback addresses the needs of each individual which the child can replay again and again to fully understand the correct pronunciation.

The Tech Department at the IC vets every digital tool used in classrooms to ensure age appropriateness, features that enhance the educational process, and offer ease in capturing student voice. The students are absolute whizzes with anything digital, and simply love to talk. It's a win-win for everyone!!


