From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Over the course of our lives we all encounter many different social obligations, for example: a family wedding, a friend's graduation ceremony or the funeral of a neighbor. We use the word, "obligation," not because it is something that we



do or attend only because it is expected. In most cases, we go willingly because we want to be there. However, we realize that because of the ties of family and friendship, we will be missed if we are not there or if we fail to recognize the important event in some way. The expectation is that we honor the relationship and acknowledge the importance of having that person(s) in our lives. In most cases, this also means that those we might honor with our presence and support will also, in turn, honor us, when it is our turn to have a significant moment in our lives. "What comes around, goes around," or so the saying goes. Reciprocity helps us to share in the happy burden of offering hospitality to others, knowing that it will soon be our turn to enjoy being a guest. On a good day, there are mutual blessings to be had by all, when social obligations are honored, kept, and shared.

This weekend's Gospel invites us to consider an alternative obligation that presents itself in stark contrast with how we often deal with our family and friends. It is that of our obligation as citizens of Heaven, as Sons and Daughters of the Most High, to offer hospitality precisely to those who cannot repay us in this world, that we might enjoy the eternal gratitude of the One who can repay us in the next. While it might be beyond most of our means' to provide a banquet as lush as that which is pictured on this week's bulletin cover, each of us can make our own efforts to care for those in need and seek to welcome those who have little in this world into our lives.

There is a beautiful prayer in the Wedding Ritual that is often prayed over a newly-married couple at the conclusion of the ceremony:

May God the Eternal Father keep you of one heart in love for one another, that the peace of Christ may dwell in you and abide always in your home. May you be blessed in your children, have solace in your friends and enjoy true peace with everyone.

May you be witnesses in the world to God's charity, so that the afflicted and needy who have known your kindness may one day receive you thankfully into the eternal dwelling of God.

I think it carries beautifully this vision of "welcoming those to our earthly tables" who might otherwise not have food to eat, necessary clothing or shelter, proper medical care, or may simply be lacking the essential ingredients of human friendship and love. To fulfill this weekend's Gospel does

As it turns out, quite lavishly indeed, from the One who loves and sees all. Let us, then, be about fulfilling our obligations before the Lord, knowing that recompense will surely come....



Solar Power Coming to IC School



We are very excited to announce that this fall we plan to install a series of solar panels on the flat roof of IC School! As part of their final efforts before dissolving the foundation, the Trustees of the Newburyport Area Industrial Development group sent a generous donation that we have held aside for use in this project. IC School has enjoyed a long partnership with NAID in receiving smaller grants over the years due to our school's commitment to offering a significant educational choice for Newburyport families. In addition to this final NAID grant, we will also be relying on an investment of some parish funds to complete the work. The planned project will be for an approximate 82 kilowatt solar farm that will meet most or all of the school's electrical needs throughout the year. Projected payback on the initial investment is about 10 years, based on current electric rates. The total lifespan of the equipment will be 25-30 years, with a net savings for the school and parish expected to be close to \$600,000.00. Additionally we intend to include an educational component of the solar project in the school curricula to help educate the IC School students about renewable energy. Stay tuned for more information in the months ahead!




