From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

St. Paul's first letter to Timothy cuts right to the chase: it answers the "what" of God's actions on our behalf. "This saying is trustworthy and deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save



sinners." (1Tim1:15) The rest of our Scriptures go on to answer the "why" and "how" of it all. The "why" part is fairly simple—because it is God's will. No way to argue around that one! God gets what God wants. Plain and simple. But the "how," now that is where all the drama and intrigue come in!

Playing out in the fullness of our human history, God patiently sets in motion His plan of salvation, tolerating even for a time, the most egregious of sins, that in the end, all righteousness may be fulfilled. Exactly "how" God does all this will play out differently for each person, yet all are grounded in the fundamental mission of Christ which is echoed in the much-loved story of the Prodigal Son: "But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found." (Lk 15:32)

Whether it was Moses interceding on behalf of the "stiff-necked" rebellious people, a shepherd rejoicing over a lost sheep that has been found, a woman celebrating over a found coin or the context of it all—Jesus eating and spending time with sinners and tax collectors—the result is the same: Jesus is out to save sinners. Jesus is out to find that which was lost. Jesus is out to bring healing where there was illness and disease. Jesus is out to restore trust, where there was once suspicion. Jesus is out to bring forgiveness where once there was only sin and division. Jesus is out to bring back to its proper place all who had strayed.

The "how" has captured our imagination and hearts over the millennia, but let us not forget about the "what" of it all. It is amazing to witness the many varied ways and the extreme lengths that our God will go to accomplish His Saving Will. It is breathtaking to see the vast diversity of ways that God works to bring home that which has been scattered. It is deeply encouraging to realize the unfathomable depths of depravity and shame from which God can call us to reconciliation and new life. That any one of us might hope to be the beneficiary of God's Grace is itself a gift from the Lord.

So, three little questions—"why," "what," and "how." The answers to which all point to a Who, Whom we are called to be in an eternal and life-giving relationship with. The rest of it is all details. . . wonderful, life-changing, magnificent details! But let's not get so caught up in the details that we lose the "what" of it all. Jesus came to save us. Period. Full-stop.

May we find peace and lasting consolation in the simple truth of it all.






