From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

On first glance, it might seem that the Steward in this weekend's Gospel might fall into the category of a "disgruntled former employee." Having been caught cheating his Master and just freshly-fired, he



decides to really screw his former boss over by cheating him even further and wrongfully writing-off legitimate debts. One might think that the appropriate response from his Master after discovering this would be to fly into a rage and have him thrown into jail or given over to the torturers until he repaid the last penny . . .or so other passages of Scripture might suggest. Fire and brimstone were, perhaps, not out of the question in this scenario.

All this might be the case, except for one little detail: the real currency of ancient times, and sometimes of today is not found in measures of olive oil or bushels of wheat (or shekels, or gold, or silver...) but in something that is harder to quantify: honor! It might seem strange that the Master of this Steward would praise his former employee for what seemed to be making matters worse. Not only had he been cheating his Master out of some of his property, but then when called on it, he gives even more of it away to countless debtors! How can something like that be praised in any way? A little cheating led to a mountain of dishonesty. And if you stick strictly within the ledger lines of "money owed," you'd be right to question this insanity.

But the people of Jesus' time—wealthy and poor alike, valued honor far more than tangible goods. To be a person of little physical means but great honor was to be incredibly wealthy, and to be filthy-rich but without a shred of honor was the very definition of wretchedness and poverty.

So, what actually is being praised in today's Gospel parable is the shrewdness of the "Dishonest Steward." What he actually did, instead of impoverishing his Master further, was to use his devious skills one more time to the true benefit of his Master. In his Master's name (and whose else would have been taken seriously?) the steward wrote off huge sums of debt that was crushing the life out of so many of the poor who could never afford to repay it and would have always lived in a state of debt and poverty, barely eking out a living. That "his Master" would have been so generous and magnanimous to do such a thing would have greatly and very significantly increased the Master's honor among not only those whose debts were eased but also among everyone else they told. And good news like this would have spread like wildfire among a vastly poor and struggling peasantry. In time, it is highly likely that every shekel's worth of forgiven debt would have come back to the Master in some way or another, and with significant interest! The love of the people for the Master would have gone right through the roof! What he might have lacked in debt measured on paper, would have been more than made up for in kindness and good will.

So, what Jesus is lifting up in this parable is the ingenuity

that is used in such a way to increase the Master's honor, challenging us to go and do the same in this world in such a way that God's honor is increased. In other words, if the worldly can be so darn clever as to find a way to increase their true wealth even in the face of material loss, how much more should we be trading in lasting wealth — the things that matter to God?! Ought not our actions, shrewdly and forthrightly, bring greater glory to God? Even if we fail and fall short of the true glory that is God, ought not we be able to figure out a way to increase God's honor, the esteem that other's might offer to God? Can we not, as Jesus challenged us, find a way to use the passing things of this world so as to gain greater treasure in Heaven?

We increase God's honor (the praise of God) when we care for those in need, when we offer love in the face of hatred, when we choose to forgive instead of holding a grudge, when we broker peace in the face of conflict, when we model patience for others despite pressure to react, when we make time for prayer and silence in the midst of many competing demands, when we seek to see God's presence in others rather than settle for mere human substitutes.

And if we struggle in any way to do the things above and many others called-forth from us in light of our Baptism, we must double our efforts, increase our creativity and expand our imaginations so that God will be praised in all things. If limited human wisdom can do this, redeemed humanity on fire with the presence of the Holy Spirit can truly excel at it! Let us, then, be passionate about serving our God!

As the Scriptures proclaim: "To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory, and might, forever and ever." (Rev. 5:13)






