From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

In the world of advertising, there are all kinds of attractive and compelling ways to draw potential customers to your product. Flashy media, engaging music and interesting salespeople are just a few. Often, companies will try to



come up with a really catchy phrase or line that can be easily repeated over and over again. McDonald's did this a few years ago with their "I'm lovin' it" ad campaign. Nike found success decades ago with their line, "Just do it," and the New England Patriots caught national attention a few years back with Bill Belichek's famous quote, "Do your job!" It is hard to know just how many more hamburgers McDonald's sold from the success of their one-liner ad, but it certainly didn't hurt business.

I'm not sure the same can be said about Jesus' line in this weekend's Gospel passage, "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." (Lk 14:27) Talk about a sales-downer! Of all the things that Jesus could have said to attract disciples and promote His message, telling people that they have to carry a cross and be crucified has got to be at the bottom of the list! I mean, He could have emphasized eternal life with God, the joys of Heaven and the whole light burden / easy yoke thing. . .just to name a few. Even His hard-to-swallow demand that we sell what we have and give to the poor is easier to stomach than impaled extremities and a spear into your side. Yikes! Who could possibly want that?!

So, what gives? Is this really what Jesus wants for us who follow Him?

First of all, a reality-check. Although in Christian history, many tens of thousands of our brothers and sisters in faith were actually crucified as testimony for their service to the Lord, and many tens of thousands more gave their lives in various macabre ways, the vast majority of us who have followed Him since the beginning were never required to undergo that explicit form of sacrifice in response to His call. Christ's crucifixion did entail several things, however, that all genuine believers must embrace to follow an authentic path of discipleship.

To begin with, the Cross was a complete emptying of everything Christ was, in surrender to God's Salvific Will. In other words, Jesus held nothing back. He conformed His intellect and will. He gave up His dignity, He let go of every shred of modesty, He surrendered His body, He gave up His life-breath. . . . He abandoned His very spirit unto God. When all was said and done, there was nothing left on the Cross that Jesus had not given back to God. So, "Taking up one's Cross" means a radical surrender of self to Godbody, mind and spirit. Think about it for a moment: from the time that each of us woke up this morning, how many choices have we made that are our own? For example: when to get up, what to have for breakfast, whom to speak with, where to go, what to do, our further plans for the day ...? For most of us, we make these choices quite often based on our own inner desires and what commitments we have made, not at the direction, or enslaved by the

circumstances or will, of others. In following Christ, are we willing to surrender that autonomy and be led to places where we would rather not go? Do not think for a moment that Christ wanted to die on the Cross. What He wanted above and beyond every human desire and longing, was to do His Father's will. Are we willing to pray that same prayer that He prayed when He was in that garden at Gethsemane: "Father, not My will, but Yours be done!"

Agony or not, for most of us, on most days, the sacrifice we may be called to make, the self-surrender we may be invited to embrace will be small. An extra moment of patience here. A lingering prayer there. An embrace of a conversation we might otherwise have shunned. An intentional visit to someone in need that might otherwise have been put off. A specific choice to choose another's good or happiness over our own. And every once in a while, God will ask more.

The other lingering aspect of carrying one's Cross is the willingness to be led, even if that leading seems to be headed towards oblivion. Jesus didn't take a leisurely stroll through Jerusalem to His death. He was bound and practically dragged through the streets. He didn't fight back, however. Although His physical fatigue caused Him to fall several times along the way, He didn't resist and try to fight back. He didn't curse those who cursed and mocked Him. He even prayed for the soldiers who would pierce Him and inflict unimaginable pain in His failing body. He allowed Himself to be led down this wretched and bitter path to what was most certainly an agonizing and shameful death.

How often do we surrender and allow ourselves to be led by others? It can be mighty difficult to give in to the will and desire of those that we love, never mind to be docile to those who might wish us harm or even despise or hate us. Being led means we let someone else drive, someone else navigate, someone else choose. As a disciple of Jesus Christ, this means we must learn to let God lead us. That first involves working out any trust issues we may have with the Lord. Maybe we have a lot of trust issues...?! How often have we had a prayer that seemed to go unanswered? How often have we sought help from the Lord and heard only silence. How often have we tried to forgive another who has deeply wounded us, only to cycle back again and again on the hurt and not feel even one ounce of the peace we might seek? How often do we wonder if God is even out here, somewhere, to hear our feeble prayers? Trust issues! Oh yeah. That's where the Cross becomes real. That's where carrying it teeters on the line between insanity and insecurity, from commitment and collapse.

The Cross will never be the center of a feel-good advertising campaign pitched to win over the masses. It may be, quite simply, the worse turn-off in human history for doing anything that God might require of us. But that isn't why we follow Jesus. We don't follow Him because of a slogan or byline. We don't follow Him because He is trendy or fashionable. We don't follow Him even because we

particularly like Him all the time. We follow Him because we believe that He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. We follow Him because we have come to believe that He is the Son of God and that we will find forgiveness of our sins in Him and no one else. We follow Him because we believe that we will have eternal life in His name. We follow Him because... to whom else would we go?

We follow Him, because, as the Psalmist says, "In every age, O Lord, You have been our refuge." (From Ps 90)

May the Lord guide and lead and bless us in the days ahead.
