From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

It must have been one hell of an apple!

Think about it for a moment: for Adam and Eve to violate God's command, to jeopardize their place in paradise, to entertain sin and invite death and destruction to wreak havoc on all of



creation...that apple really must have been something! Right? Why in anyone's right mind would they risk eternal bliss in the garden of Eden for anything less, right?!

Well, all drama aside, it might have just been an ordinary apple. A nice one, but just an apple, like many others on various trees throughout the garden. In fact, we don't even know it was an apple—the Bible simply refers to it as "fruit." As far as the story of creation goes, every fruit-bearing tree was there, so, take your pick: apple, banana, coconut, pear, pomegranate, peach, fig, apricot, orange...you name it. So, why did they do it?

Temptation takes many forms. In this case, it took the form of a snake—the most cunning of all creatures. The methodology was simple: promote half-truths and mask lies with false promises. (Sound familiar?!) The snake told them that they would not die if they ate the fruit (a lie), but that they would become like God (a half-truth-they already WERE made like God in God's image—see Psalm 8). They were told that their eyes would be opened and that they would know good and evil (another half-truth-their eyes were opened to see that they were naked, but knowledge of good and evil always was and always will be elusive, at best). It was a raw deal. Paradise was traded for a life to be lived in struggle, sweat, and toil—one that would ultimately end in death, not only for them, but for everyone that would follow and for all of creation. So high a cost for disobedience and and lack of trust in God's plan.

That better have been the best, most awesome, succulent, delicious and mouth-watering apple that every existed for so high a cost!

But it probably wasn't. It was just an apple, eaten without permission, consumed in violation of God's command, the food of impetuous rebellion. It was just a sin, like the many gazillions that would follow in all of us who descended from Adam and Eve. And it tasted good, or at least OK at the moment. And then, it began to decay like our human nature. What was sweet and firm became rotten and mush, unfit for anything but to be buried in the ground where it will return to the clay of the earth from which it first sprung. So, too, sadly, ...us.

Adam and Eve didn't start their day, that fateful day, by deciding to sin and turn away from God. Though they encountered temptation, they were not innocent of all wrongdoing. It wasn't a "trick" that caused them to stray, as if the real blame and complete responsibility could be shifted to the reptile. No, they freely chose to "give it a try," to see God's word as not so absolute, His command as not so compelling. They entertained the idea that God was

holding something back from them that they deserved or somehow had a right to. They inhaled the ever so slight effervescence of envy or fancy or arrogance or privilege. They, if even for the smallest moment, thought that God wasn't as great or amazing or all-caring or trustworthy as they once thought God was. Just a split-second of doubt. Just a momentary lapse of judgement. Just one precious second when their free will was diverted from instinctually doing God's will to something else. That's it. Just that one, tiny, little itsy bitsy minute choice.

And here we are, millennia later, still suffering from ravages of that first, ill-thought failure to love God with all of our heart. Oh, to get a do-over, and go for the orange or banana instead! Anything but that...apple!

Fortunately and through no merit of our own, God has given us a second chance in Christ to become holy, just as He is holy. We begin that journey anew each year as we embrace the holy season of Lent and undertake various forms of penance that will strengthen our discipline to do good and avoid evil, to right wrongs and make amends. We rend our hearts back to God, trusting (this time!) in God's merciful love. In that, the Eden which was lost will become a new Heaven and new earth, a new city of Jerusalem, coming down out of Heaven from God, beautifully adorned as a bride prepared to meet her husband! The fruit of our sincere penance before God will help prepare a pathway to the paradise yet to come.

May this holy season be fruitful and filled with many blessings for us all!

Guidelines for Lent

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter. Fasting during Lent

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting. Catholics over 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to the obligation of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed.

Abstinence during Lent

Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. On days of abstinence, meat may not be used at all. Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence.

AED and First Aid Kits

We have purchased additional stop-bleed kits for our locations. They, along with AEDs or Automated External Defibrillators kits and updated first-aid kits have been installed in all of our worship spaces and parish halls. We now have 2 in each church and in the IC Parish Center.

The total cost for these complete kits (AED, stop-bleed, and first aid) with their respective cabinets and required supplies has increased to a total of \$17,533 (\$2,192 each). To date we have received \$7,793 in donations to help pay for the purchase of these life-saving kits.

We still need \$9,740 to cover the costs of all 8 kit locations. We invite parishioners who are able to consider making a donation to help pay for these potentially life-saving kits. Full or partial donations for these sets are welcome and appreciated for both parishes.
