

IC Haiti

On the weekend of December 20–21, just before Christmas, the second collection at all weekend HRIC Masses will be taken up for IC Haiti. The generosity of parishioners has been outstanding throughout 2025 in support for IC Haiti's ministry to the children of Puit Chacha, Haiti. For the past fifteen years we have provided for their educational, nutritional, safety, and health needs despite all the violent political disruptions and natural disasters in Haiti.

Let us not give up on our brothers and sisters in Haiti. Just as the Good Samaritan didn't give up on the beaten man he found on the road to Jericho. Just as the Prodigal Son's father did not give up on him. Just as Our Crucified Lord did not give up on the thief who was dying at his side. Just as Our Lord has not given up on us.

In this regard, please take some time to reflect upon the inspiring words of Pope Leo at the end of his recent letter "Dilexi Te" to Christians throughout the world.

Our love and our deepest convictions need to be continually cultivated, and we do so through our concrete actions. Remaining in the realm of ideas and theories, while failing to give them expression through frequent and practical acts of charity, will eventually cause even our most cherished hopes and aspirations to weaken and fade away. For this very reason, we Christians must not abandon almsgiving. It can be done in different ways, and surely more effectively, but it must continue to be done. It is always better at least to do something rather than nothing. Whatever form it may take, almsgiving will touch and soften our hardened hearts. It will not solve the problem of world poverty, yet it must still be carried out, with intelligence, diligence, and social responsibility. For our part, we need to give alms as a way of reaching out and touching the suffering flesh of the poor. (119)

Christian love breaks down every barrier, brings close those who were distant, unites strangers, and reconciles enemies. It spans chasms that are humanly impossible to bridge, and it penetrates to the most hidden crevices of society. By its very nature, Christian love is prophetic: it works miracles and knows no limits. It makes what was apparently impossible happen. Love is above all a way of looking at life and a way of living it. A Church that sets no limits to love, that knows no enemies to fight but only men and women to love, is the Church that the world needs today. (120)

Here, they rebuild trust, find purpose, and learn to serve others.

popularly known as Trappists." (www.spencerabbey.org).

Each day, silence was broken while joining the monks in celebrating morning lauds, Mass, evening vespers, and nightly compline accompanied by chant, Scripture, and Psalms. Fr. James served as Spiritual Director for the group leading discussion, reflection, and reconciliation.

It's a small world: Ann Messina and Sally Talford discovered a connection to Fr. James from Holy Rosary Church and School and the former Venerini Sisters in Lawrence and delighted in conversing with him in Sicilian.



Brother Jude invited us to share in the rich collection of relics the Abbey has acquired. Housing relics of over 100 prominent saints including Anne and Joachim, St. Anthony and Mary Magdalene. He

meticulously maintains this sacred collection he considers

our "family in faith."

We were treated to the full supermoon following the snowfall. It was the last full moon of the year and will retain the title of "the highest moon in the sky" until 2042!

The Abbey's healing graces flow both from the monastic prayer life inside the Abbey, as well as from the natural surroundings of the Abbey's 900 acres.

We thank Fr. James, Brother Jude, the Guest Masters, and all the monks at the Abbey for welcoming us so warmly into their monastic life. May our Lord and Savior bless the St. Joseph Trappist community with a joyous Christmas and a peaceful, hope-filled New Year. We look forward to our visits in the future.

IC SVdP Annual Report

Dear Parish Family,

On behalf of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, we extend our heartfelt gratitude for your generous support. Your donations have made a profound difference in the lives of our neighbors in need. As we complete another year of service, our Annual Report to the Archdiocese shows that:

- We received 202 calls to our help line.
- We were able to assist 272 individuals.
- We conducted 118 face-to-face meetings to provide personal care and compassion.
- We paid rents for 19 families, helping them avoid eviction.
- We provided food assistance to 71 people.
- We covered auto repairs for 16 families, ensuring they could continue working and caring for their loved ones.
- We served 50–60 people each week in our dining room and prepared 35 additional take-out meals at the "Breaking Bread" free meal Tuesday.

Beyond these direct services, your prayers and encouragement have strengthened our outreach. The oven used for our Breaking Bread free meal on Tuesdays was constantly in need of repair. Hearing of this challenge, our Society applied for a grant from the State of Massachusetts under the section "Helping to Alleviate Food Insecurity." We were blessed to be approved for \$20,000, which allowed us to purchase a new commercial oven and a refrigerator. This investment ensures that our Tuesday meals will continue to be served with dignity, reliability, and love.

These numbers and stories are more than statistics—they represent families kept in their homes, meals shared at tables, and hope restored in times of hardship. None of this would have been possible without your kindness and commitment to living out the Gospel message of charity.

Thank you for being the hands and heart of Christ in our community. May God bless you abundantly for your generosity.
