Lectio Divina/Divine Reading is a reading of, reflecting on, responding to, and resting in the word of God. In group Lectio Divina members share, at deepening levels, their reflections and response to the word of God that has been read.

Laudato Sí

Purpose: In response to Pope Francis' urgent call for the care of our common home in his encyclical, *Laudato Sí*, the HRIC Collaborative *Laudato Sí* group meets to look at actions we can take to better understand the dynamics of local climate change and solutions to address environmental concerns. A variety of topics are presented by local and national experts on recycling, composting, planting of native species, the importance of bees, and planning for food sustainability.

Honduran Coffee Project

Purpose: For over 20 years, IC has been selling Honduran coffee shipped directly to us from a poor parish in the mountains of Honduras. Fr. Ray Richard, a Newburyport native and Capuchin missionary priest, realized that the farmers in his parish in Honduras were receiving only \$1 per pound for their coffee. He helped to teach them how to maximize their yields and improve the quality of their beans, and arranged with their sister parish in Newton, MA to ship the raw beans directly to a roaster in Orange, MA. IC began ordering periodic roastings of whole bean coffee to sell to our parishioners.

We currently sell about 240 pounds of coffee each quarter (whole bean and ground). All the proceeds go back to the farmers who now receive a fair price for their crops and are better able to support their families.

Lifelong Faith Formation

Purpose: Catechesis and life-long faith formation of children, youth, and adults in both parishes of the Collaborative. This involves ongoing faith formation for children and Sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation and Eucharist (typically 2nd grade) and Confirmation, now in 8th grade. We strive to include the parents in the formation process, knowing that this is a privileged time for a family to grow in faith together.

OCIA

Order of Christian Initiation for Adults

HRIC Collaborative Pastoral Council



Purpose: The Pastoral Council was formed to assist the pastor in his responsibilities of planning, organizing, initiating, promoting, coordinating, and reviewing the evangelization, worship, religious education, and service activities within the Collaborative. They serve in a consultative role and there are members from both parishes.

Who: Members are chosen by lot after a period of prayer and silent reflection. Members chosen will serve for three-year terms. Each summer, interested parishioners are asked to submit names for consideration.

IC Wedding Coordinators

Purpose: This ministry is a rich opportunity to work with couples at a very special time in their lives. The wedding coordinator acts as the liaison with the parish and the wedding party, offers hospitality (unlocking doors, lighting, Sacristy access, PA system, closing up, etc.), collects paperwork (the wedding license to be presented to the officiating clergy before the marriage can be witnessed, and collecting any monies due). The coordinator is present for the rehearsal to assist in any way needed as well as on the wedding day (arriving early, arranging furniture, lining up everyone, coordinating with the musicians, insuring all paperwork is signed).

St. Vincent DePaul Society

The Vincentians may collaborate with other local groups in advocating for our neighbor's needs and addressing the cause, making no distinction of race, creed, or national origin. Vincentians, on a rotating basis, retrieve **Help Line** messages, respond to requests, and conduct home visits with those in need. Our conference depends totally on donations and fundraisers to support our activities.

SVdP Drop Boxes: Immaculate Conception SVdP offers a clothing drop box located behind the IC Parish Center, nearest Green Street.

Holy Redeemer SVdP offers drop boxes at two locations. One is located in the Nativity church parking lot and another is located at the West Newbury Food Mart parking lot (Main St.).
