

# *St John Bosco Parish – Faith Formation Guidebook*

Our program aims to help children and their families know God and His church in order to better love and serve Him and others in their lives. Through regular participation in the celebration of the Mass and sacraments, a personal prayer life, classes, youth ministry events, family activities, and service projects, we hope our students not only learn about Christ and their faith but how to model His life and live out their faith in meaningful and beautiful ways.

## **Family Centered**

Your family is such an important part of our program and your child's faith formation. Our goal is to support you as the first and foremost catechist of your child! By regularly reviewing these material and prayers and engaging in the ministry opportunities our parish offers, your family can grow alongside your child in the faith.

## **Service**

The Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy are the ways through which we are asked to serve God and love one another. We join our students and their families in seeking those in need around us and ministering to them in the ways our faith teaches us to.

In lower grades, we focus on opportunities for families to serve together; in the middle school years, the themes of Catholic Social Teachings are introduced and opportunities increase for our teens to learn about the needs around them and to serve. By our confirmation program, students are fostering service-minded hearts, logging at least 10 hours of service a year in our parish, their schools, and the local and global communities.

## **Youth Ministry**

Our parish Youth Ministry Program is an important partner to our Faith Formation Program – allowing our students the opportunities to grow in their faith, explore specific questions and interests, find support and prayer in difficult times, and enjoy a sense of community with other parish teens.

## Pre-K – Grade 1

**Focus: Family and God**

### Our Faith and Church

- The Holy Family: Mary, Joseph, Jesus
- Creation is a gift from God. We were created by God in his image each with a divine purpose.
- We are members of God’s family through the Sacrament of Baptism
- God asks us to join Him in Mass every Sunday

### Our Prayer Life

**The sign of the Cross (words and actions):** In the name of the Father (right hand touches forehead), and of the Son (touch heart), and of the Holy (touch left shoulder) Spirit (touch right shoulder). Amen (hands together at heart)

#### Prayer Before Meals

Bless us, Oh Lord, and these, your gifts, which we are about to receive from your bounty, through Christ our Lord. Amen

#### Guardian Angel Prayer

Angel of God, my guardian dear, To whom God’s love commits me here, Ever this day be at my side, To light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.

#### Night Prayer

Now I lay me down to sleep, I pray the **Lord** my soul to keep; Thy angels watch me through the night, and keep me safe till morning’s light. Amen

## Grade 2

**Focus: My Church and the Gift of Reconciliation**

### Our Faith and Church

- General order of the Mass: Welcome, Forgiveness, God’s Word, the Eucharist, Closing

- Genuflection (method and meaning)
- We are not perfect like God; He forgives us when we sin and strengthens us through sacraments and virtues
- Sin is knowing what God wants and choosing to do otherwise
- God gives us Free will to choose to do good and make good choices
- The Holy Spirit helps us make good choices
- The Bible is Holy Scripture and the Word of the Lord
- **Reconciliation/Penance:** The Sacrament in which sins committed after Baptism are forgiven by God. It provides gifts of healing, forgiveness, mercy, and grace. It restores and strengthens our friendship with God.
  - Before the Sacrament of Penance, I perform an *examination of conscience* to reflect on my sins.
  - I come to the Sacrament of Penance with contrition (sorrow) for my sins.

## Our Prayer Life

### Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

### Our Father

Our Father, Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name; Thy Kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

### Act of Contrition

Oh my God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against You Whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with the help of Your grace, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Amen

## Our Lives and Witness

- We pray for, and serve, those who need our help in our family, school, parish, community, and world
- We love others as God loves us
- We forgive others (friends and family) as God forgives us
- We ask God regularly for His forgiveness when we choose to act against His wishes.
- We recognize one of the five precepts of the church is to go to confession at least once a year.
- We receive God's grace through reconciliation

## Preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation

- Parents and parish catechetical leaders, together with the pastor will determine when children are ready to receive First Penance-Reconciliation after the age of 7, which is the age of reasoning.
- Children must receive the Sacrament of Penance-Reconciliation for the first time prior to their first reception of the Eucharist.
- Readiness for reception includes a child's ability to understand his/her capacity for both good and evil through free will, to engage in a simple examination of conscience, to confess his/her sins to a priest

and recite the appropriate prayers of penance, to recognize God's unconditional love, and appreciate the power of God's forgiveness and grace.

- The child regularly attends Mass with his/her family and recognizes the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross saving us from sin and death.

## Grade 3

**Focus:** The Gift of the Eucharist

### Our Faith and Church

- Baptism and First Holy Eucharist are Sacraments of Initiation
- Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation is a Sacrament of Healing
- Forms of Prayer: repentance, petition, intercession, thanksgiving, praise
- The liturgical year follows the life, death, resurrection, and gift of Jesus.
- The 12 Apostles followed Jesus and spread the faith.
- The four marks of the church: One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic
- The Church is the people of God, the Communion of Saints, a light to the world

### Prayer and Scripture

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be world without end. Amen.

#### Lectio Divina (5 R's of "Divine Reading")

- **Read**
- **Reflect** on the meaning
- **Respond** in prayer
- **Rest** in contemplation with the Lord
- **React** by forming an intension

#### Prayers of Intercession

#### St Patrick's Prayer

Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ within me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ at my right, Christ at my left, Christ in every eye that sees me, Christ in every ear that hears me.

### Our Lives and Witness

- We thank God for the gift of our life by using our talents to help others

- We show our faith through actions and service
- We are called to spread God's Good News
- We care for God's creation
- We celebrate and understand the meaning of events in the Liturgical Year, especially Advent and Lent
- We attend weekly Mass and experience Jesus through the Eucharist each Sunday

## Preparation for First Holy Eucharist/Communion

- Preparation for the first reception of the Eucharist begins with the child's family; family has the most important role in communicating and modeling the Christian and human values that form an understanding of the Eucharist
- A child's participation in weekly Mass with his/her family is crucial in order to fully understand, appreciate, and internalize its value for one's life and experience the powerful liturgical prayer of the assembled church.
- The pastor, along with parents, catechists, and catechetical leaders, decide the readiness of each child to receive First Holy Communion.
- Readiness for reception includes a child's ability to accept in faith that the Eucharist is the "Real Presence" of Christ's Body and Spirit; to appreciate the gift of this sacrifice and saving grace; to understand that it commemorates Jesus' last meal with his disciples; to see the importance of receiving the sacraments of Baptism and First Reconciliation before First Holy Communion; to receive the Eucharist in an informed, reverent manner; and to seek the Eucharist weekly in attending the Mass.

## Grade 4

**Focus: The power and beauty of the Mass**

### Our Faith and Church

- The five precepts of the Church: to attend Mass on Sundays and Feasts of Obligation; to go to confession at least once a year; to receive Communion during the Easter season; to keep holy the Feasts of Obligation; and to observe the days of fasting and abstinence.
- The 10 Commandments and the Beatitudes are God's guidebook for us to follow
- A covenant is a promise/agreement between God and his people
- The Mass is a celebration of God's death and resurrection and his life in us.
- We are part of the universal church as part of our parish, deanery, and archdiocesan.
- The Greatest Commandment: Love God with our whole hearts and others as ourselves

### Prayer and Scripture

#### Confiteor

I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done, and in what I have failed to do; through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God. Amen

#### Prayer of St Michael

### Focus: The gifts of the Seven Sacraments

## Our Faith and Church

- The Creed is a declaration of our Catholic beliefs: One God in the Trinity, redemption, sanctification, Mary is Mother of God, Communion of Saints.
- The sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation should be received regularly to strengthen and renew us.
- The meaning, impact, and power of the sacraments need to be realized in the Catholic life
- The Grace of God is given through the Sacraments

**Sacraments of Christian Initiation:** Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist

**Sacraments of Healing:** Reconciliation/Penance, Anointing of the Sick

**Sacraments at the Service of Communion:** Holy Orders, Matrimony

## Prayer and Scripture

### Apostle’s Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

### Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

### Our Faith and Church

  - You shall not make for yourselves an idol
  - You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God
  - Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy
  - Honor your father and your mother
  - You shall not murder
  - You shall not commit adultery
  - You shall not steal
  - You shall not give false testimony
  - You shall not covet your neighbor's goods
- The 46 books of the Old Testament contain the roots of our faith and are fulfilled in Jesus Christ
- The 27 books of the New Testament contain Jesus's life and lessons and those of his earliest followers

  - The 4 Cardinal Virtues (Human Virtues)
    - Prudence, justice, fortitude, temperance
- A vice or sin is knowing what God wants and choosing to do what you want instead.
  - The Seven Deadly/Capital Sins
    - Pride, greed, lust, anger, gluttony, envy, sloth

### Grade 10

#### Focus: Sacrament of Confirmation and the journey forward

#### Our Faith and Church

**Confirmation:** A confirming and strengthening of the grace of Baptism.

- A special outpouring of the Holy Spirit like that of Pentecost.
- The soul of the baptized Christian is imprinted with a permanent seal that marks this individual forever.

- The Sacrament of Confirmation roots the recipient more deeply as a son or daughter of God, binds the recipient more firmly to Christ and to the Church, and reinvigorates the gifts of the Holy Spirit in the soul.
- The Sacrament of Confirmation gives a special strength to witness to the Christian faith.

- We discern our path forward from Confirmation, thoughtfully choosing ways to contribute to our parish and community and to continue to grow in our faith.
- We become missionary disciples, armed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and God's grace to make a positive impact on all those we meet.
- We continue to model Christ's love and service among our friends, family, and larger communities.

## Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation

- Students prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation during a two-year program in which they are asked to apply what they've learned in grades 1-8 about their faith, find important ways to grow in their faith through various parish ministries, engage in meaningful service to others, and reflect on their readiness for, and commitment to receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation.
- Students choose the name of a saint whom they admire for certain qualities, who will guide them and intercede on their behalf, and to whom the student will pray throughout their lives.
- Students choose an active Catholic to be his/her sponsor in Confirmation – someone they admire for their witness and model of the faith.
- Students attend a Reconciliation service and Confirmation Retreat during the program so that they prepare their minds and souls accordingly for receiving the Sacrament.

- Students will meet with the parish priest and program coordinator to discuss their basic knowledge of their faith, their prayer and faith life, and their experience of service as well as thoughts about, any questions regarding, and preparation for receiving the sacrament.
- Students will formally request the Sacrament of Confirmation from the Bishop; they will state what they've done in preparation for receiving the sacrament and why it is they want to receive it.
