0 is the number of priests currently ministering in the Archdiocese of Hartford who have been credibly accused of sexual abuse of a minor. The Archdiocese of Hartford exercises a zero tolerance policy regarding sexual abuse.

35



Of all the 1,000+ archdiocesan priests since 1953, 35 have been the objects of legal settlements or otherwise credibly accused of sexual abuse of a minor.

84



84% of the settlements paid are attributable to 2 priests.

1990



98% of settlements paid were for allegations of clergy sexual abuse of a minor that occurred before 1990.

In the last 20 years, 2 archdiocesan priests have been credibly accused of sexually abusing a minor during that period. Both of those were criminally charged and prosecuted for their crimes.
