### **ST. BEN'S**

Inspired by the gospel of Jesus and the example of St. Francis of Assisi,  
the Capuchin friars of the Province of Saint Joseph,  
together with our partners in ministry,  
prayerfully build sister-brotherhood in the world.

#### **St. Ben's Community Meal**

- St. Ben's Community Meal is served six nights a week, Sunday to Friday, from 5:15 to 6:30. In 2015, 105,226 meals were served for an average of 347 meals per evening.
- 2,569 Local Bus Tickets and 159 Intercity Tickets served.
- 1,457 were served Prescription Co-pays and 2,450 guests received hygiene items. Many were provided haircuts, showers, eyeglasses.

#### **House of Peace**

- The Emergency Food Pantry served 17,848 individuals, provided formula to 553 infant homes, 5,664 senior stock boxes and bread to 15,799 people.
- At Thanksgiving we served Holiday Food Boxes to 1,651 households with 4,047 individuals. At Christmas we served 1,330 households with 6,239 individuals.
- Families with children participate in the Christmas distribution because toys, books, and warm clothing are provided with the boxes. The completed boxes that returned to us weighed 215,248 lbs. The estimated value of those food boxes was over \$115,000!
- The Capuchin Clothes Closet served 15,171 individuals last year. All clothing is new or gently used, and all clothing is distributed free of charge.
