Goals Achieved in 2018-2019

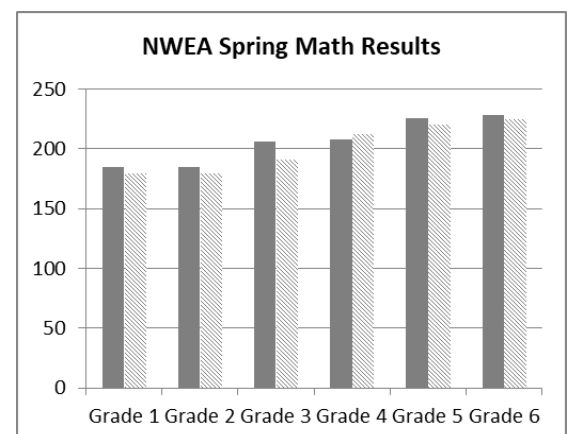
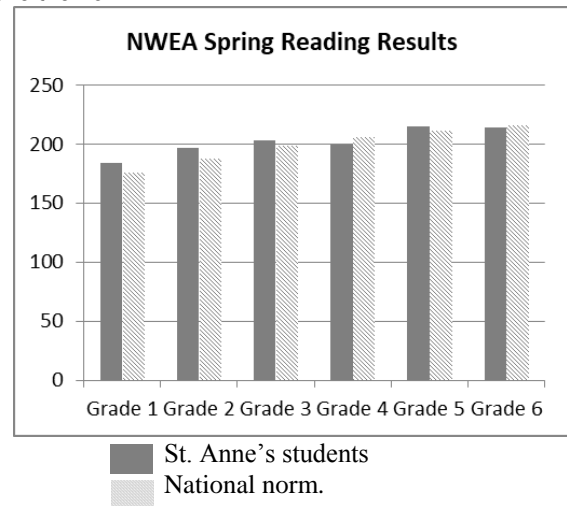
- Religion curriculum aligned to Diocesan standards. Instructional materials purchased.
