Proceedings:

Meeting called to order by Father Norm
Time: 10:00 am

The meeting began with introductions, prayer and ground rules.

Jim Zwisler served as the facilitator as we continued the Idea Circle process by beginning the following:

- Step Three deliberation of Action Ideas by discussing pros, cons and trade-offs
- Step Four common ground for Action Ideas by deciding which actions to implement and in what order.

Participants were reminded of the following prompt:

What is your #1 Action Idea as to how St. Vincent DePaul Parish can strengthen its engagement and outreach to its surrounding community on issues related to LGBTQ+ diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Jim shared the outcomes of the May 13 meeting which included the #1 Action Ideas that were proposed and the common themes:

Common Themes of Action Ideas

- Dialogues/Conversations/Education
- Activities (e.g., dinners, fairs, community involvement) and Services (e.g., support for LGBTQ+ service providers located within parish boundaries)

Grouping #1: Dialogues/Conversations/Education

- 1. Actions Speak Louder Than Words: lead and not judge; educate and communicate; acceptance with respect; patience and time; history has its eyes on us.
- 2. Don't force the issues but approach all people with kindness, patience and understanding. Don't give up on developing this model for the greater community.
 - a. Assume good will
 - b. Recognize the value of each person's opinion, especially in a community like St. V.
 - c. Listen, and listen some more
 - d. Persuasion is **not** an exercise where bludgeoning **or** demeaning one another are useful tools.
 - e. Attitudes do **not** change overnight; they evolve
 - f. Speak with the idea that you are planting "seeds of thought"
 - g. Caveat: MLK: "Letter from Birmingham Jail".
- 3. As the church reaches out to the larger community find a constructive way to help those within the church express their concerns as change can be hard and frightening.
- 4. Start with yourself: Why am I here? Where am I? If we were to ask others to join know why you (I) are here. Keep it simple.
- 5. Move to increase knowledge and tolerance. Know people as people not issues. Move out of comfort zone. Support others in their journey. Jesus is the answer.

Grouping #2: Activities and Services

- 6. Begin offering an additional service for LGBTQ+ folks, with family, friends, and all others who would like to come.
- 7. Begin an initiative to educate a wider group of people (i.e., the parish community) about **both** a) the experience of the LGBTQ+ community in the world **and** b) authentic church teaching on sexuality and accompaniment (i.e., not a polarized discussion on church teaching).
- 8. To be public in our parish's affirmation regarding the LGBTQ+ community / how is our welcome published?
 - a. Putting the parish's stance in the bulletin
 - b. Questionnaire regarding: parish's stance
 - c. Word of mouth having info you have learned to share
 - d. Be a role model.
- 9. Sponsor a four-part interactive series to be publicized to parish and to wide community with topics such as:

- a. Listening and sharing stories to better understand LGBTQ+ experiences
- b. Catholic Christian understanding of approach to people of diverse sexualities
- c. Understanding of commission formation
- d. Ways to reach all people.
- 10. Outreach, Communicate & Educate increase opportunities for communication and education on LGBTQ+ issues, and implement outreach so that the wider community knows this parish is open to all.
- 11. Get a table at Akron Pride and publicize that participation to parish/community ahead of time.
- 12. Advertise group's existence and welcoming nature to parish, especially younger parishioners and/or families.
- 13. Invite a member of the LGBTQ+ community to speak at a church function and/or someone from the parish to talk about family member of the LGBTQ+ community.
- 14. I like the idea of having a table at the Pride event. Maybe get t-shirts and walk in the Pride walk.
- 15. Make it so an internet search for an "LGBTQ+" or similar idea would come up with St. Vincent. Have something on the church website saying we are LGBTQ+ friendly.
- 16. Be willing to stand at the front of our church at Sunday Mass and tell my feelings on LGBTQ+ - and ask other members, if they have similar feelings to join us in a show of support.

Using the numbered list of Action Ideas above, Jim facilitated **Step Two** of the process involving the **collapsing and combining** of the common themes of Action Ideas. The results of this activity were:

Dialogues/Conversations/Education

Pros

- better understanding
- we become more empathetic
- open hearts
- proceed with respect
- responding to Synod
- healing hurts
- more unified
- living our parish's mission
- the importance of our efforts
- embrace being uncomfortable

Trade-offs

Respect parents' flow of information to their children

Cons

- talking with no action
- push back
- fear is out there
- alienation leaving parish/church
- intangible/unmanageable results
- overcome us vs. them attitudes
- what would Jesus do?
- our own hang ups
- time

The pros, cons and trade-offs for the common themes Activities and Services will be determined at the July 8 meeting to complete Step Three. We will then begin Step Four which will determine the common ground for action: questions and consideration to help the group decide which action(s) they would like to implement and in what order (prioritization).
