- Entrance into the chapel is only for those who have the combination and have been approved to enter. Please do not let those who are waiting at the door for entrance to go in unless you personally know them. Issues have arisen where suspicious individuals are wanting to enter.
- There is a five-person limit in the chapel at any time. First preference is given to those adorers who are scheduled for the hour.
- Individuals must be masked the entire time they are in the chapel.

Curb-side Senior Thanksgiving Dinner


