WHAT IS THE CHURCH?

- 2. To you, what is the one quality of the Church that is most important?
- 3. Who are the people who most represent for you what the Church is all about?
- 4. List your reasons as to why these people represent the best what the Church is all about.
- 5. What do you think Jesus would list as the key ingredients necessary for the Church to stay alive?
- 6. Write your definition to the question: What is the Church?
- 7. Does your definition of Church include the words; *Jesus, people, family, love, prayer, Bible, wisdom, follower, community?* All of these words are part of the meaning of Church as Jesus planned it.



THE VISION OF JESUS

As we read the Gospels, we see the kind of life Jesus led. We see the model of the kind of Church He wants us to be part of. During His life, Jesus spent time with people. He prayed with them. He ate with them. He wept with them. He shared joy with them, and He healed them both physically and spiritually. Jesus was in relationship with others.

This is what each of us is called to BE and DO through our relationships with God and others as members of our Christian Church. In many ways, we are asked to be a family – people who care through listening, praying, celebrating, forgiving and helping one another. Christians put love for others into action, just like Jesus did.

The Church offers us a "give and take" relationship. There are things the Church needs from us to keep it ALIVE in its service to God and people. There are also things we need from the Church- on a regular basis and, at special times in our lives. You will now be taking a closer look at some needs of the Catholic Church Community, and some of your needs as a member of this community.
