ACTION

REFLECTION
When Peter named who Jesus truly was in that passage from Matthew that you read earlier, Jesus then gave Peter a tremendous responsibility by making Peter the leader for His Church. If we truly believe that Jesus is the Son of God, we too have a tremendous responsibility in carrying out our beliefs about Jesus through the lifestyle we choose to live.
Our picture of who Jesus is will always be enhanced if we pay attention to the way Jesus is portrayed through the stories of the Gospel writers. We need to spend time reading Scripture, if we are to get to know Jesus better as we grow spiritually.
When we spend time reading Scripture, we may have questions about how we are called to live our lives. Take the time to look at Jesus' responses to people in the Gospels. He is asking each of us to pay special attention to the ways He showed His love and care for others through His words and actions. Jesus is inviting us to do the same in our lives.
