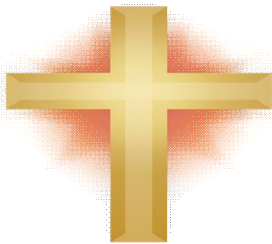

From Fr. Pat: Fast and Feast in Lent

- ◇ Fast from judging others; feast on the Christ dwelling in them.
- ◇ Fast from apparent darkness; feast on the reality of light.
- ◇ Fast from thoughts of illness; feast on the healing power of God.
- ◇ Fast from discontent; feast on gratitude.
- ◇ Fast from anger; feast on patience.
- ◇ Fast from pessimism; feast on optimism.
- ◇ Fast from complaining; feast on appreciation.
- ◇ Fast from negatives; feast on affirmatives.
- ◇ Fast from hostility; feast on non-resistance.
- ◇ Fast from bitterness; feast on forgiveness.
- ◇ Fast from self-concern; feast on compassion of others.
- ◇ Fast from discouragement; feast on hope.
- ◇ Fast from facts that depress; feast on truths that uplift.
- ◇ Fast from problems that overwhelm; feast on prayer that undergirds.

Rice Bowl on your Dinner Table for Lent

Take home a cardboard RICE BOWL to place on your dinner table. On every day of Lent Each person at your table says a prayer and places some monies in the rice shaped bowl for the poor, lonely and displaced of Oregon and further.

PRAYER, FASTING and ALMSGIVING are the directives of the Lenten observance culminating in Easter and the hope you bring to many people as you return your RICE BOWL to the Church in Holy Week and Easter.

Fasting Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence. The normal fasting ages are 18 until age 59 & some are excused from fasting for medical reasons. Though not obligatory, the Archbishop has asked us to keep Friday's free of meat. Abstaining from meat on Friday starts at age 14.
