Discussion. . .Prayer. . .and Potluck!

On Sunday afternoon November 3, sixty people gathered for discussion, prayer and a potluck. The reflection and discussion started with Bishop Barron's Book, A Letter to a Suffering Church. Small groups formed with three questions to consider and a general discussion followed. Fr. Jonah opened the conversation with the whole assembly and moved between tables asking for input as he held each thought with compassion. It was a wonderful exchange between Fr. Jonah and various members that brought up very difficult questions about the church, the sex abuse crisis and where we go from here. The discussion could have gone on for much longer than the hour and fifteen minutes it did.

We then moved the energy to the church where Fr. Jonah provided an opportunity for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Healing Prayer, Anointing of the Sick and Reconciliation. All were invited to participate as the spirit moved them. Our own Fr. John and Fr. David generously lent their support.

The final portion of the evening allowed all the fellowship of sharing a meal in the Parish Center. The evening provided time for opinions, discussion, prayer, healing, silence, and fellowship.
