


Countless days on a journey that led so far.

for nothing was like anything they'd dreamed.


Anticipating the royal, and those honored by this world.







People: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.







COMMUNION SONG CHILD OF THE POOR/ WHAT CHILD IS THIS


