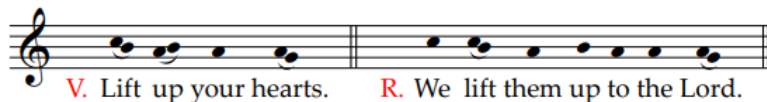
After the second intonation, all light their candles from the flame of the Paschal candle. Continue holding the lit candles through the singing of the Exsultet.
