

The nursery is located down the hall from the commons in the Family Life Center.





therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin,


all the Angels and Saints,



THE THIRD SCRUTINY (SUNDAY)

A scrutiny is defined as a searching study or an examination. The RCIA scrutinies are "rites for self-searching and repentance and have above all a spiritual purpose. The scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to strength all that is upright, strong, and good." (RCIA 141)

PROFESSION OF FAITH - THE NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven,

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.







COMMUNION ANTIPHON




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SUNDAY Ev - ery-one who lives and be-lieves in me will not die for ev-er, says the Lord.

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




