

At our Palm Sunday liturgies, we will gather outside the church to begin Mass. We remember our Lord's arrival to Jerusalem by waving palm branches, singing a song of praise, and processing into the church (as we are able).

On Saturday evening, the procession will begin in the Commons. On Sunday morning (weather permitting), the procession will begin in the parking lot, just in front of the steps at our main entrance.

he came down from heaven,


(bow) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.
