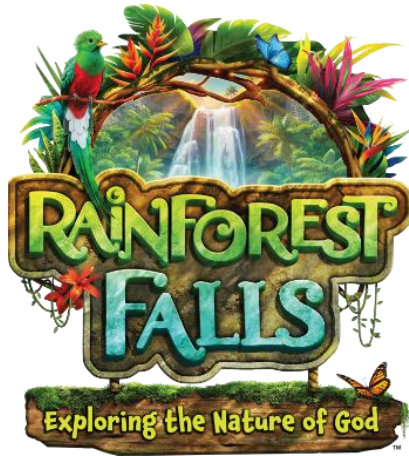


This Novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus draws its daily devotions from the *Litany of the Sacred Heart*.
