PSR Transition to Seventh Grade Confirmation

In December 2024, Bishop Duca announced his decision to move the age of Confirmation from 11th Grade to 7th Grade. "Our children are experiencing a culture which, at times, is hostile to our faith. Through social media of all forms, young people are confronted at a surprisingly younger age with challenges to their Catholic faith and morals. Given this new reality, I believe it is time to lower the age of Confirmation to give our children the full grace of the Sacrament of Confirmation at an earlier age to meet these challenges." -Bishop Duca . Moving forward, you may see other churches use different approaches to implement these changes. Based on our parishes' needs and the resources available to us, we feel the following plan is the best way to implement these changes beginning in the 2025-26 PSR year. For clarity, classes will be referred to using their high school graduation year as follows:

11th grade students - Class of 2027 Current 10th grade students - Class of 2028 Current 9th grade students - Class of 2029 Current 8th grade students - Class of 2030 Current 7th grade students - Class of 2031 Current 6th grade students - Class of 2032 Current 5th grade students - Class of 2033 Current 4th grade students - Class of 2034

How will this look for our cluster?

Currently, students must be enrolled in and faithfully attend PSR all years prior to receiving the sacrament of Confirmation. Going forward, students who will receive Confirmation in 7th grade, must attend PSR all years (3rd-6th) between First Communion and Confirmation.

PSR Year 2025- 26: Class of 2027 will receive the sacrament of Confirmation on Tuesday, January 27, 2026 and Class of 2028 will receive the sacrament on Monday, June 1, 2026. Both will be held at St. Joseph in Paulina at 6:00 pm.

PSR Year 2026- 27: Class of 2029 and 2030 will receive the sacrament of Confirmation on a date s TBD.

PSR Year 2027- 28: Class of 2031, 2032, 2033 will receive the sacrament of Confirmation on a date s TBD.

PSR Year 2028- 29 and beyond: 7th grade students will receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

Students currently enrolled in Catholic school who will make Confirmation in our cluster will follow this same format.

We have decided to implement our program in semesters, in order to achieve this goal. Below you will find the layout of how this will look.

Policies for Youth Faith Formation in the Cluster

Dress Code

It is the obligation of our church parishes to provide a proper educational and religious atmosphere which shall be conducive to the learning process as well as spiritual growth and morality. Students, teachers, and staff have the right to be free from distractions which hinder the learning process and go against the moral code. No mode of attire will be considered proper for school wear that distracts from or disrupts classroom learning. The DRE makes the final decision as to what is considered proper or improper dress according to the guidelines provided.

The Parish Staff believes it is the responsibility of each student/parent to use good judgment in one's total appearance so that the attention of others is not distracted from the purpose of their school.

Boys: Your own school approved uniform or: a sleeved shirt and pant or short (not more than 3" above the knee).

Girls: Your own school approved uniform or: a sleeved shirt and pant or short/skirt/dress (not more than 3" above the knee).

<u>Not allowed</u>—Sleeveless, cut-off shirts, backless, strapless, low cut or crop tops shirts. Shirts containing inappropriate words or graphics. Hats are also not allowed.

Attendance Policies

It is the obligation of our parishes to provide a consistent and enriching program for our students. Students are expected to attend all classes and to be on time.

Make-up Work:
