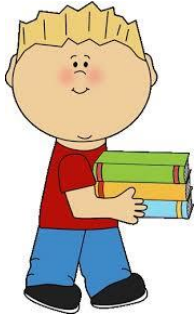

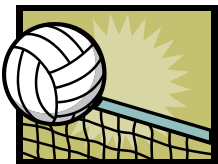

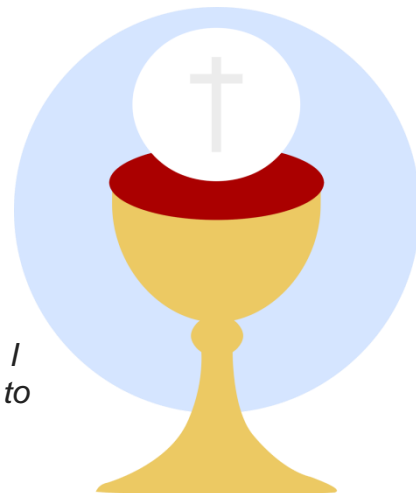

COUNSELOR'S CORNER – Mrs. Teri Ricker

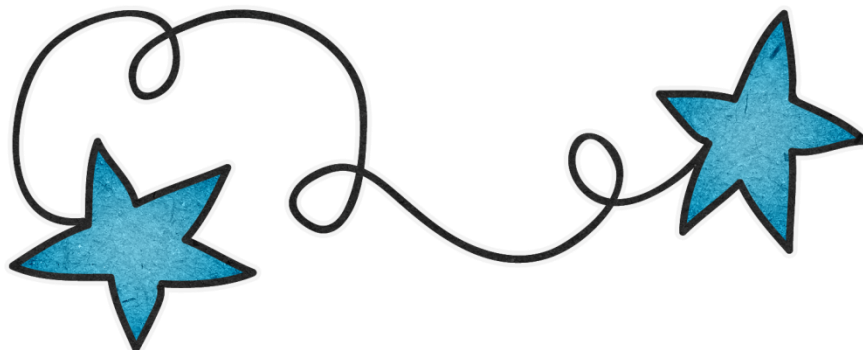
The school year is rapidly coming to a close and students are naturally getting antsy for summer to begin. If you're noticing your child losing motivation for school, the below 5 tips may help to keep him/her engaged these last few weeks:

1. *Give in to the great outdoors.* With the warmer air and sunshine, make a point of quenching your child's thirst for time outside. Any time you spend outside with your child will help manage his need to escape the indoors while he is busy learning in the classroom or at home.
2. *Ask questions.* Contrary to what you may hear from your child, the time in the classroom is valuable right up to the last day of the school year. Avoid the impulse to focus on upcoming summer activities but continue to ask about the day's lessons and encourage a strong finish.
3. *Maintain a routine.* Make a point of maintaining consistency in your child's homework time, family mealtime, bedtime, wake-up time, and any other daily rituals you have. This will help keep your child in the mindset for school.
4. *Reflect on the year.* For students, each school year is a distinct experience. As the school year is wrapping up, make it a priority to help your child reflect on all that he has learned over the past nine months. This type of reflection is a great way to get your child thinking about all the progress he has made and motivate him to keep up the academic momentum.
5. *Provide some incentive.* Never underestimate the motivating power of a little reward. Think about different incentives you can offer your child for displaying continued effort and achievement at school during these final weeks. Maybe it's an extra hour of TV time if the night's homework is completed before dinnertime or a special outing if a certain grade is achieved in a subject that's been challenging. A special game night with mom or dad is another possible reward. Big or small, dangling a carrot can make a big difference in keeping your child engaged at the end of the school year.

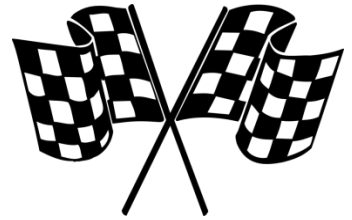

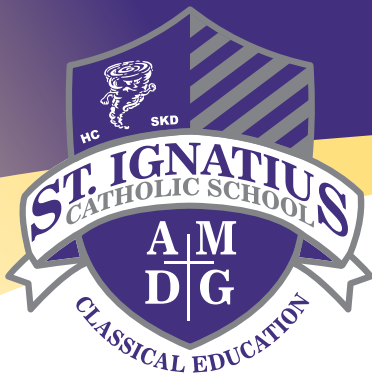

Height: 48". Weight: 30lbs.**

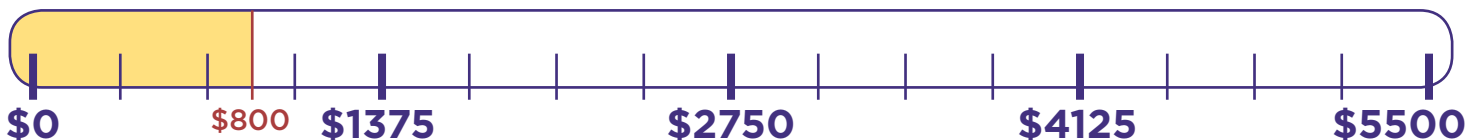

2019 5th Grade Girls Volleyball Season Information

The St. Ignatius Athletic Association offers instructional volleyball to girls in 5th – 8th grades. Plans are in progress for the upcoming 2019 fall season. The 5th grade season consists of 5 to 6 matches and possibly one tournament. The season runs from late August until early October. The volleyball season does not interfere with the basketball season. The coaches will stress fundamentals. ***This is a great opportunity to explore the sport of volleyball. We encourage all girls to sign up and give volleyball a try.***

The practices will begin the week of August 12th. More details will follow once we have the sign up returned.

A deposit fee will be collected. The deposit will be returned after return of the uniform as long as a parent works in our concessions or admissions area when scheduled. We ask each parent to work 1 to 2 times during the season, at our 8th grade tournament in September and at the Men's Open Basketball tournament in the spring.
