

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Dear Friends:

Many years ago my father's law firm, Fredrikson and Byron, endowed an annual lecture series at the University of St. Thomas Law School's Holloran Center for Ethical Leadership in the Professions, specifically in honor of my Dad. He lived long enough to attend the first few of those lectures, but they have continued on since his death, most recently last week. Every year his children are invited to the event and to a very lovely dinner that follows, and I am always honored to attend. His old friend Tom Holloran and wife Patty, after whom the Center is named, continue to attend as well. It was Tom who had my father hired at the law firm (then consisting of four lawyers) in 1956, before he left to become CEO of a little upstart company called Medtronic. Last week's lecture featured Preet Bharara, who was the U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York until being fired earlier this year by President Trump (together with just about every other U.S. Attorney). About 500 people attended the event at St. Thomas' downtown Minneapolis campus. It is always a point of pride for me to know that the main thing that my Dad is remembered for in his years of lawyering is his sense of morality and justice. In fact, it is he who showed me that it is possible to be a very successful attorney and a good, decent human being at the same time...something I would not necessarily have otherwise believed.

Anyway, in the follow-up conversation to the lecture the question was raised about how businesses discern how to hire ethical people when they interview potential new employees for leadership roles. Panelists included top executives from United Health Care and from 3M. They agreed that the most critical thing is to make an interviewee "think on his/her feet" in response to a hypothetical ethical question. It seems that one of the great temptations in the workplace is to notice what appears to be unethical behavior, either by an individual or by a corporate system, and not to say anything about it to anybody. So, for example, the question is asked of a potential employee what they would do if they happened to experience such a thing. One possible response would be to blow the whistle immediately to senior management. Another would be to ignore the situation out of a desire to keep one's job safe. All were in agreement that neither person would be the one to hire. The ethical leader, rather, is one who both dares to ask questions about what is going on and to recognize that he/she may not be in possession of all the information that is needed to make a competent decision about ethics. It seems simple, but it is hard when it gets put to the test.

I mention all this here because I think there are clear parallels with the lives of Christians as we strive to be people of virtue. In any community to which we are attached there are things that can strike us as "fishy" when it comes to ethical/moral behavior. It may be that we are accurate in perceiving that, or it may be that we are not in complete possession of the facts about what is actually happening. It requires both courage and humility to rest in that mushy middle ground—to speak up when we are convinced that people or structures are behaving badly/sinfully, and to be open to correction when we presume to know more than we know or to judge others without being fully informed. It was a great experience to be part of that lecture event last week.

On a completely different note, I want here to acknowledge, with profound thanks, Deb Jaworski, our second grade teacher at St. Pascal's School, who is retiring this week after decades of dedicated, loving service to our kids. Deb is also a regular parishioner here, so I trust she won't be going away, but it will be a new time of life for her and for our community. May her next chapter of life be blessed; she has earned that!

**Preschool & Elementary School Changes**

After 32 years of teaching at St. Pascal's, Deb Jaworski has informed us that she would like to retire this month. Deb started teaching at St. Pascal's in 1985. She fondly remembers being called and offered the job on her birthday. Many of our parents were blessed having Deb as their teacher and many of their children have experienced Deb's gift of teaching. All of us at St. Pascal's wish Deb the best as she moves into her retirement years. Thankfully, she has agreed to come back and be a substitute teacher for us, when needed. We held a retirement celebration with the children during lunch on Tuesday, October 17. There will be a school and church retirement party for Deb at a later date.

Starting Monday, October 23, Colleen Urness will move from director of the Early Childhood Learning Center to teaching 2nd grade. Colleen has 33 years of experience teaching K-2 grade and is eager to return to the classroom. Principal Laurie Jennrich will assume preschool director responsibilities.

**Middle School Changes**

Based on the current enrollment in grades 5-8 we are making some additional changes in the middle school. Starting on Monday, October 23, Maureen Peterson will move to part-time. She will continue to teach 6th-7th-8th grade Language Arts, Media Studies and middle school/elementary art. Pam Campbell will continue to be the lead 5th grade teacher. In 2013, a couple of parishioners decided to pursue the idea of reaching out to other St Pascal's parishioners and ask the question "Are you interested in helping our parish endure for future generations through planned giving?" These conversations lead to the creation of St Pascal's Legacy Society. Since then 29 families and individuals have become members. In addition, 3 parishioners have chosen to make memorial gifts in memory of loved ones to the St Pascal's Endowment. The names of the members are listed on the reverse side of this sheet. Thank you to all these legacy society members and to all parishioners that have included St Pascal's in their estate plan. Thank you to the both the Men's and the Women's club who have consistently provided funds to build the endowment.

**Who can become a Legacy Society Member?** Anyone who makes a planned gift will be eligible for membership in the St Pascal's Legacy Society. St Pascal's Legacy Committee wants to spread the vision that St Pascal's is a parish with a great future, and is doing so by encouraging planned gifts among our members and supporters.

**What is a planned gift?** A planned gift refers to gifts made through a will or revocable trust, beneficiary designation of retirement plan assets or life insurance policies, and other specific tax-wise giving tools, that allow donors to make a substantial difference in the future of organizations that they care about. The Legacy Society's definition of planned gift is any gift, made in lifetime or at death as part of a donor's overall financial and/or estate planning.

**Where will the money go?** Designation of your gift is up to you. Perhaps you want to help build the St Pascal's endowment, or pay down the principle of our mortgage, or provide scholarships for our school. What legacy do you want to leave your church community?

**St Pascal's Endowment** - Our endowment is a part of planned giving to provide St Pascal's with financial stability. St Pascal's endowment is a permanent endowment managed by the Catholic Community Foundations. As of October 10, 2017 the endowment had a value of \$226,540.

The Legacy Committee is made up of the following people: Ellen and Mike Aeling, Susan Hommes, Brigid O'Malley, Joe Sullivan, Theresa Ruttger, and Fr. Mike Byron.
