FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Opening the gift of the Sacraments. Last Sunday afternoon I was at the Cathedral of St. Paul for the Confirmation Mass with our high school Confirmation candidates. Congratulations to all our teens that were confirmed that day! It was a wonderful liturgy. During the homily at the Mass, Archbishop Hebda spoke about opening the gift of the Sacrament of Confirmation. He said that sometimes the Sacrament of Confirmation might be an unopened gift for us because we don't open our life to the gifts of the Holy Spirit that are given to us at Confirmation. Maybe we allow the gifts of the Holy Spirit to sit on the shelf in our spiritual life. The Archbishop encouraged the teens to open the gift of Confirmation and to share their faith and the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our Church and world.

Opening the gift of the Sacraments can be a helpful image to pray about and explore in our spiritual life. Do we think about our Baptism from time to time? Do we reflect on our First Holy Communion and give thanks for the Real Presence of Jesus at every Holy Communion we receive? If we have received the Sacrament of Confirmation, do we regularly ask the Holy Spirit to bear fruit in our life as we utilize the gifts of the Holy Spirit: Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord? If we are married, do we daily ask for God's grace to deepen our love for Christ and for our spouse? If we are ordained, do we daily ask for God's grace to deepen our love of Christ and for the people we serve? When we go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, do we share with other people the healing of forgiveness that God has given to us? If we have received the Anointing of the Sick, do we open up the gift of God's healing presence amid our daily pains and struggles? The seven Sacraments are beautiful gifts of God's grace, and we can open the gift of the Sacraments our entire life.

Option 1: Joseph's Coat

Joseph's Coat is a free store located in St. Paul that provides goods and services to those in need, within an environment of dignity and respect. People of all ages, ethnic and cultural backgrounds, abilities and challenges are welcomed and served.

Option 2: Community Action Partnership of Ramsey and Washington Counties Reach Out for Warmth Fund

Reach Out for Warmth is an emergency fuel fund established to assist local households after energy assistance funds have been exhausted.

Option 3: Food for the Poor

Food for the Poor is an ecumenical Christian non-profit organization that provides clean water, educational opportunities, emergency relief, food, healthcare and secure housing to the poor in Latin America and the Caribbean.

ADULT FAITH FORMATION

Encountering the Compassionate God of the Bible with Art Zannoni

Thursday, March 14 at 7:00 PM in Brioschi Hall

The Bible reveals both a compassionate God and Jesus as the compassion of God. This program will explore the biblical roots of compassion in both the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) and the Gospels. The presentation will be divided into two parts. The first part will explore the importance and meaning of the Hebrew and Greek terms for compassion followed by examples of how God acts compassionately throughout the Hebrew Scriptures especially in the book of Exodus, the Psalms, and the book of Isaiah. In the second part, emphasis will be placed on Jesus who is presented in the Gospels as the compassion of God. Examples will be given of Jesus acting compassionately toward crowds, toward men and women, at meals, and in the parables that he tells. The presentation will conclude with a challenge to all faithful followers of Jesus to act compassionately toward everyone they encounter.
