Option 1: Progressive Baptist Church Fishes and Loaves Food Shelf

The Progressive Baptist Church Fishes and Loaves Food Shelf is located within Progressive Baptist Church at 1501 Burns Avenue in St. Paul and it provides emergency food items to anybody in need.

Option 2: Saint Paul Area Chamber of Commerce Charitable Foundation

The Saint Paul Area Chamber of Commerce Charitable Foundation is a charity that is collecting donations to support the community with direct financial support to small businesses and non-profits to help them rebuild their storefronts, reopen their businesses and serve neighborhoods after the recent civil unrest that has taken place.

If your child will be 3 on or before September 1, 2020, they will be eligible for our preschool classes. There are half- or full-day options. If your child will be 4 on or before September 1, 2020, they will be eligible for prekindergarten full-day classes.
