

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This weekend is the third in a row that we hear from Chapter 6 of the Gospel of John. We spend the 17th-21st Sundays of Year B hearing from Chapter 6. (Note: our Sunday lectionary readings are organized into a three year cycle of Years A, B and C. Our current year of 2021 is Year B, the year 2022 will be Year C, the year 2023 will be Year A, and so forth.) This year is unique because the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary occurs next Sunday, August 15, and we will hear Luke's account of the Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth. But then on the following Sunday (August 22), we will hear verses 60-69 of John, Chapter 6. Why do we hear so much from John, Chapter 6 in mid-summer of Year B? I think the reason is that John, Chapter 6 contains The Bread of Life Discourse so named because the Lord speaks about himself as the Bread of Life. Since John's Gospel does not contain an account of the Last Supper as do the other three Gospels, commentators have noted that John, Chapter 6 contains important elements of John's theology of the Eucharist, namely: Jesus' body and blood are true food and drink (verse 55), and Jesus said, "the one who feeds on me will have life because of me" (verse 57). Let us drink in the words of John, Chapter 6 and allow them to deepen our love of the Lord. Among his beautiful words for this Sunday are: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." (John 6:51).
