FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

You are invited to the 25th Priesthood Anniversary Celebration for Father John Mitchell on Sunday, October 24 in Brioschi Hall after the 8:45 and 10:30 AM Masses. I invite you to celebrate my 25 years of priesthood. I was ordained as a priest on May 25, 1996. I thank God for these 25 years and counting! Come join me after the 8:45 AM Mass for coffee and donuts. Then after the 10:30 AM Mass, we will have coffee, donuts, food and beverages and an Open House from 11:30 AM - 2:00 PM with visiting, reminiscing, photo memories, and more. All are welcome!

You are invited to a parish meeting on Thursday, October 28, 6:30 PM in Brioschi Hall to discuss options for Father John Ryan Field. In 2002, our parish completed a major building project including a new church and improvements to our campus facilities. The total cost was \$8.3 million, and \$2.1 million was raised in the initial capital campaign and paid upfront. The parish borrowed the remaining \$6.2 million from Premier Bank. As of August 31, 2021, we owed \$3,166,168.61 on our mortgage. The current interest rate on our mortgage is 3.85%, and our monthly mortgage payment is \$22,400. At our current pace, it will take approximately 16 more years to retire our mortgage. There is an option to consider for strengthening our financial situation: selling parish assets and using the proceeds to pay down our loan. One such parish asset is the 2.25 acres of property owned by our parish across White Bear Avenue from our church. The property is bordered on the north by Third Street East and on the west by White Bear Avenue. The owner of Mike's Auto Repair rents the northwest portion of the property from our parish. Father John V. Ryan Memorial Playground takes up most of the rest of the property. Over the years, the property has served as a ballfield, school playground, Christmas tree lot, and a location for dumping excess winter snow from our parking lots and sidewalks. In addition, our Men's Club currently stores various items in a small garage on the property. Prior to the COVID-19 outbreak, the Parish Finance Council consulted with Cushman and Wakefield, a property management firm, about the property. They advised us that prior to shopping the property and learning who might be interested in purchasing it, we should establish that parishioners are agreeable to selling the property. As you ponder this question, you should assume that the property would be put to good use and utilized for something in accord with our values or at least not offensive to us or disagreeable to the neighborhood. No decision needs to be made quickly. We invite you to share your thoughts and insights at our parish meeting on October 28.

St. Pascal Baylon Parish will host the Venezuelan Mission 50th Anniversary Celebration on Saturday, October 2 at our regular 4:30 PM Mass. Our parish was honored to be asked by the Archdiocese if we would host the 50th Anniversary Celebration which includes the 4:30 PM Mass followed by a dinner in Brioschi Hall. Archbishop Hebda will be the presider at our Mass on October 2, and there will be visitors from Venezuela and other parishes. Thanks for your hospitality in helping our brothers and sisters feel welcome.

After the 4:30 PM Mass on October 2, there is room for up to 30 St. Pascal Baylon parishioners to attend the Venezuelan Mission Celebration Dinner in Brioschi Hall.
