

Freedom House is a day shelter located at 296 W. 7th Street in St. Paul that is operated by the Listening House. It offers similar services to the Listening House with the addition of laundry, showers and semi-private rooms with beds to sleep. Freedom House is the result of a successful collaboration between the City of St. Paul, Ramsey County, the St. Paul City Council, the St. Paul Fire Department, community members, local businesses and partner agencies.

St. Paul Residents: Rent Stabilzation up for vote for on November 2, 2021

St. Paul City Council unanimously approved the rent stabilization ballot language that will be put to voters on November 2. If passed, the measure would institute one of the country's most rigorous rent stabilization policies and the state's first.

What is Rent Stabilization?

- Rents can only increase up to 3% in a year
- Landlords can apply for exceptions for capital improvements, maintenance, or swings in property taxes
- Stays in effect even when the tenant changes

Rent stabilization is not rent control or ceiling. Historically, BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) renters face the worst rent spikes. BIPOC households saw a cumulative rent increase of 32% over the past two decades, while white households saw a cumulative increase of just 18%.

Developers will continue to factor in rent, inflation, and taxes into how they set their initial rents. By stabilizing rents, people would be more likely to stay in their house or apartment.

The City Council is also allowed to amend the ordinance 12 months after passage if needed. If passed, the rent ordinance would take effect on May 1, 2022.
