— SOCIAL JUSTICE & CARING -

On the weekend of March 5 - 6, St. Pascal's parish will gather the loose change and bills from the collection and donate them to the Social Justice and Caring Committee's *We Care Campaign*. The three options chosen by the committee for its winter project are:

Option 1: Christian Cupboard

Christian Cupboard is an emergency food shelf located on the grounds of Guardian Angels church in Oakdale whose mission is to provide nutritious food to its neighbors in a respectful manner while engaging the community in the fight against hunger.

Option 2: Feed My Starving Children Feed My Starving Children is a Christian non -profit organization that provides nutritious food to children worldwide.

FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Fasting: On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics between the ages of 18 - 59 are allowed only one full meal. Two smaller meals are allowed as needed, but solid foods between meals is not permitted. Those excused from fasting and abstinence include the physically and mentally ill and pregnant or nursing women.

Abstinence: Catholics 14 years or older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and the Fridays of Lent.

Alternatives to fasting from food include fasting from television, social media, complaining, or getting in the last word. Other alternatives to fasting include being cheerful, giving compliments to people, refraining from our favorite foods, or getting up a little earlier than usual for spiritual reading or prayer.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 27

Pray Always and All Ways: Multiple Intelligences and Prayer

Erin O'Leary, M.A.Ed., Ed.S. has worked in the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis for 30+ years as a Director of Faith Formation, Catholic school teacher, and administrator and curriculum developer. Her degrees are from the University of St. Thomas and St. Catherine University. Erin has given presentations and retreats both nationally and locally. She currently works at the Church of the Holy Name in Minneapolis where she is Director of Faith Formation and is also an educational consultant, presenter and contributing writer for Our Sunday Visitor Publishers.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 28 Ignatian Contemplation

In the Ignatian tradition, praying with the imagination is called contemplation. It is a very active way of praying that engages the mind and heart and stirs up thoughts and emotions. It is suited especially for the Gospels, as one accompanies Jesus through his life by imagining scenes from the Gospel stories and pays attention to the details: sights, sounds, tastes, smells, and feelings of the event.

Phyllis Hamill-Little is a former high school teacher and director of faith formation in the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. She is now retired.

Visio Divina

Visio Divina is translated as "divine seeing". It is related to the prayer form Lectio Divina (divine reading), but instead of Scripture, this form of prayer uses visual elements to help set your mind on prayer. It allows God to speak into your heart through the image.

Rosary

The Rosary is a popular devotion among Catholics used to reflect on events in the lives of Jesus and Mary. It is a Scripture-based prayer and uses a string of knots or beads to count the component prayers (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be, etc.).

Deacon Rich Moore was ordained a Permanent Deacon in September of 2002. Over the last 20 years he has been a deacon at two parishes, the former St. Thomas the Apostle and currently St. Pascal Baylon. In those years he has led over 30 retreats, preached many homilies, and worked with RCIA, marriage preparation, and baptism preparation. As a convert to the Catholic faith, he is passionate to help all discover the richness of the Catholic tradition and know the loving presence of Christ in their lives.

Centering Prayer

Centering Prayer is a method of meditation used by Christians placing a strong emphasis on interior silence. The modern movement in Christianity can be traced to three Trappist monks of St. Joseph's Abbey in Spencer, Massachusetts in the 1970s: Fr. William Meninger, Fr. M. Basil Pennington and Abbot Thomas Keating. A spiritual director from Loyola Spirituality Center in St. Paul will be present. The center is a community of spiritual directors whose mission is "companioning the spiritually curious as they listen and respond more deeply to the presence and movement of the sacred in their lives."
