

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Next Wednesday, March 2, is Ash Wednesday. Join us for Ash Wednesday Masses with the distribution of ashes at 8:00 AM and 6:30 PM.

The Fish Fry is back! I am looking forward to our Men's Club Fish Fry on all the Fridays of Lent, March 4 - April 8, from 4:30 - 7:00 PM in Brioschi Hall. Takeout meals are also available. Thanks to all the volunteers who make this meal possible. We appreciate it!

Stations of the Cross. All are welcome to join us to pray the Stations of the Cross in the church on the Fridays of Lent at 7:00 PM.

As we begin the Season of Lent, the Church recommends these spiritual practices:

Prayer. Jesus spent 40 days of prayer and fasting in the desert. We can spend the 40 days of Lent in a renewal of our prayer life. Maybe we can set aside more prayer time by reducing our daily screen time (television, computer, cell phone, tablet) or by rising 10-15 minutes earlier in the morning.

Fasting. Fasting from food allows us to feel hunger and grow in sensitivity towards people around the world who lack access to food. Fasting also involves saying no to a good thing (food) so that we can build up the spiritual discipline to say no to harmful things such as sin. The Church asks Catholics from age 18 until age 59 to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday which means having one full, meatless meal and two smaller meals as needed. People are excused from fasting if they are physically or mentally ill or if they suffer from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Pregnant or nursing women are also excused from fasting.

Abstinence. The Church asks Catholics who are 14 years old and older to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and the Fridays of Lent. Since Jesus sacrificed his flesh for us on Good Friday, we can refrain from eating flesh meat on Fridays to remember the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross. Some options for meatless meals include pancakes, waffles, soup, cheese enchiladas, macaroni and cheese, fried egg sandwiches, grilled cheese sandwiches, cheese pizza, and of course, fish.

Almsgiving. Almsgiving involves sharing our time, talent and treasure with people who are in need. One option is to give through Operation Rice Bowl. Small cardboard Rice Bowls are available in our Gathering Space. Read more about Operation Rice Bowl below.

Prayer Intention of Pope Francis for February 2022: For religious sisters and consecrated women. We pray for religious sisters and consecrated women; thanking them for their missions and their courage; may they continue to find new responses to the challenges of our times.

Prayer Intention of Pope Francis for March 2022: A Christian Response to Bioethical Challenges. We pray for Christians facing new bioethical challenges; may they continue to defend the dignity of all human life with prayer and action.

Options for Women's East is a medical clinic in St. Paul that ministers to/offers free services and resources to women with unexpected pregnancies (such as education and life coaching, pregnancy tests, prenatal care, ultrasounds etc.)

RCIA: Rite of Sending & Rite of Election

March 6, 2022 at the 10:30 AM Mass

This year St. Pascal's is blessed to have Emily Nord, a catechumen (unbaptized) in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Next weekend we will celebrate the Rite of Sending—our opportunity to surround Emily with our prayer and support as she goes forth to celebrate the Rite of Election at the Cathedral of St. Paul on Sunday afternoon.

The Rite of Election is a transition point in the RCIA journey, and after this point the catechumens are referred to as the "elect" to signify their new status. This point is referred to as election "because the acceptance made by the Church is founded on the election by God, in whose name the Church acts" (RCIA #119). Election is about being chosen by God to be in relationship with God. God has chosen them to be baptized at the Easter Vigil and to continue Christ's mission in the world.

Please continue to pray for Emily and for all of those looking forward to celebrating Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil this year.

Wednesday, March 2, 2022 Even Now

Today's readings: Joel 2:12–18; Psalm 51:3–4, 5–6ab, 12–13, 14 and 17; 2 Corinthians 5:20—6:2; Matthew 6:1–6, 16–18. Have you ever walked by someone with ashes on the head and said, "Happy Lent" or "Merry Ash Wednesday"? It's likely you have not. Few associate happiness with Lent. But what do we hear in today's readings? "Even now, says the LORD, return to me with your whole heart." This Lent, once again, God calls us to return to unending forgiveness and unconditional love. God knows we have sinned, he knows that there have been times when we failed to live as disciples of his Son. And even now, at this moment in our lives, God wants us to turn our lives over to him and live

in the light of the love of his Son. What would be more joyful than basking in the goodness of God's unending love and mercy?

When we pray, give alms, and fast, Jesus asks us not to look glum or make a display of our generosity. He invites us to live authentic lives and not be like the hypocrites. Today's readings challenge us to be aware of our sinfulness, to know that when we say that we are sorry, forgiveness will be ours. Lenten practices offer an opportunity to ask God to create a clean heart within us, so that we can bring the good news of Jesus Christ our Lord to all people. Even now, especially now.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, February 28 Inheriting Eternal Life

Treasure in heaven is not measured in numbers, wealth, or possessions. God invites us over and over to turn toward Jesus and follow him. In these days leading up to Lent, set aside time to prepare for this season of repentance and baptismal renewal. What will you let go of, detach yourself from, and surrender to, in order to have a fruitful and meaningful Lent? *Today's readings: 1 Peter 1:3–9; Psalm 111:1–2, 5–6, 9 and 10c; Mark 10:17–27.*

Tuesday, March 1 For the Sake of the Gospel

Peter seems to express frustration with having given up everything to follow Jesus. Jesus' way is to rely solely on God. When our life is for the sake of the Gospel, we will receive more than we can imagine. Jesus' words contain a challenge, and this Lent can help us deepen our understanding that love, sacrifice, joy, and sorrow are all part of life. Decide today how to schedule prayer time for every day of Lent. *Today's readings:1 Peter 1:10–16; Psalm 98:1, 2–3ab, 3cd–4; Mark 10:28–31.*

Wednesday, March 2 Our Whole Heart

Through the prophet Joel, God invites us to rend our hearts this day, and return to the everlasting love that has no bounds, no limits, no conditions. Our heavenly Father asks us to return with our whole heart, and not make a lukewarm response to this invitation. Fully embrace this holy season of Lent, which gives us a chance to refocus our priorities and redirect our energies, so that we can follow Jesus. *Today's readings: Joel 2:12–18; Psalm 51:3–4, 5–6ab, 12–13, 14 and 17; 2 Corinthians 5:20—6:2; Matthew 6:1–6, 16–18.*

Thursday, March 3 A Life of Discipleship

Each of us makes hundreds of choices daily, from what to wear to how to regard the people who come into our lives. St. Katharine Drexel, whose feast day is today, treated people of every race with respect and cared for those whom society shunned. She chose discipleship over a life of privilege. Make an effort today to lose your life for the sake of the cross and, in so doing, choose life. This Lent can be a time to commit to a transformation in your life. *Today's readings: Deuteronomy 30:15–20; Psalm 1:1–2, 3, 4, and 6; Luke 9:22–25.*

Friday, March 4 Cleanse My Heart

The Church prays Psalm 51 often during Lent. The psalm is one of the great laments in the Book of Psalms, part of the wisdom literature in the Bible. While praying a lament, we join the psalmist in a plea for mercy and forgiveness. As you pray Psalm 51 today, notice how your heart responds to the moving words that believers have prayed for over two millennia. *Today's readings: Isaiah* 58:1–9a; Psalm 51:3–4, 5–6ab, 18–19; Matthew 9:14–15.

Saturday, March 5 Teach Me Your Way

The prophet Isaiah says, "If you lavish your food on the hungry / and satisfy the afflicted; / Then your light shall rise in the darkness." Who has shown you that "your light shall rise" by acting justly and removing oppressive words from speech? Who has given you courage to follow Jesus even when others may ignore their faith? Make an effort today to express your gratitude to those persons for the truth they have shared. Decide how you will share that truth with someone else today. *Today's readings: Isaiah 58:9b–14; Psalm 86:1–2, 3–4, 5–6; Luke 5:27–32*.
