

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Tree Trench and Rain Garden Project Update: Dirt and Small Rocks Installed in the Trench. This past week, the crew added a mixture of dirt and small rocks on top of the gravel and pebbles they installed the prior week. Once the trench is filled with rock, dirt and gravel, it will be paved over with new blacktop, and parking stall lines will be painted on our parking lot in the area of the new tree trench. There will be three trees planted in the trench, and a metal grate will be installed around each tree so that rainwater and melted snow can flow into the trench. Within the tree trench, the crew has already installed drain tile which is a porous pipe that collects and channels water that seeps or flows underground. Drain tile received its name from the terracotta tiles that were originally used in its construction. Many houses have drain tile installed in the soil around the house to drain water from the soil so that it does not seep into the basement. Rain and snow that fall onto our parking lot become mixed with gasoline, oil, pollutants, and suspended solids that are on the parking lot surface. The water that flows into the tree trench will seep through into the soil, gravel and tree roots which will trap pollutants and treat the water before it flows into the stormwater system beneath the intersection of Flandrau Street and Third Street. The water will eventually flow into the Mississippi River. Thanks for your patience with this project. I know it is an inconvenience to not have full use of our parking lot. The project is scheduled to be finished by October 31.

NWEA MAP Growth Testing and Individual Learning Plans (ILPs)

Over the last two weeks, our students completed the NWEA MAP Growth tests in reading and math. These tests help school staff measure the progress of each student, grade level, and the school as a whole. Now that the testing is over, teachers will begin creating ILPs. In these plans, teachers, with input from students and their families, create goals to make sure that each student is getting the resources, services, and instruction they need to be successful. While the MAP tests only test reading and math proficiency, the ILPs go beyond by taking into account other subjects and the socialemotional needs and strengths of each student. This is the fourth year that ILPs have been used at St. Pascal Regional and the first year they will be implemented across all ACA schools. We have seen tremendous growth in our students as a result of the ILPs and can't wait to see how they work at the other schools in the academy.

We are moving forward with Fall Bible studies *beginning the week of October 9*. These will be in person.

The study is Living for a Just Society from the Six Weeks with the Bible series published by Loyola Press. It is described as follows: "God is always working to bring about social justice in the world, and He invites us to join him. The 8 Focus Areas of A Road Map for 2024

1. Worship and Spirituality; 2. Hospitality and Community-Building; **3. Faith Formation**; 4. Pastoral Care; 5. Stewardship; 6. Social Justice and Caring; 7. Communication; 8. Facilities and Maintenance

Faith Formation - to provide a comprehensive parish formation ministry that helps parishioners (children, youth, adults) to grow spiritually in their knowledge of the Catholic faith, love of God, and love of neighbor.

Goals:

- Provide appropriate staff and volunteer support for faith formation and youth ministry.
- Maintain parish-based faith formation and sacramental preparation opportunities for school-aged children, youth, and adults (e.g., RCIA)
- Investigate faith formation opportunities beyond the parish (e.g., cooperation with neighboring parishes, archdiocesan programs).
- Provide and budget for quality Adult Faith Formation events.
- Cultivate a young adult community.
