FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

St. Pascal Baylon Church received a \$4000.00 grant for discipleship activities. Good news! In November, St. Catherine University in St. Paul issued this grant our parish to be used for parish-wide discipleship activities that address compelling needs in the broader community. The \$4000.00 grant is part of a larger grant of \$1,000,000 that St. Catherine University received in 2020 from Lilly Endowment Inc. to help establish the Initiative for Contemplative Discipleship program at St. Catherine University. The aim of the Initiative is to strengthen Christian congregations so they can help people deepen their relationships with God, build strong relationships with each other and contribute to the flourishing of local communities and the world. Thank you to Dr. Anne Weyandt, a St. Pascal Baylon parishioner, who is an Associate Professor of Education at St. Catherine University. She informed me about the grant opportunity and encouraged me to apply for the grant on behalf of St. Pascal Baylon Parish. Our parish is now one of several parishes in the Archdiocese that has received grant funds through the Initiative for Contemplative Discipleship.

How will we use the \$4000.00 in grant funds?

- We purchased a new vinyl banner for our monthly St. Pascal's-Merrick food distribution monthly program. We used the banner for the first time last Monday. The banner was affixed to our fence along Third Street and then taken down after the food distribution. The banner reads, FREE FOOD TODAY! 3:30-5:00 PM OR UNTIL GONE, PARKING LOT/DOOR 4.
- 2) Mardi Gras Care Card Project—Saturday, February 18, 2023. You may have seen the Save the Date announcement in the parish bulletin about our free dinner and service project on February 18 after 4:30 PM Mass. We will have dinner and then ask people to make care cards for the homebound, the sick, the grieving, or anyone who needs an uplifting note. There will be pictures that children can color and decorate to send with the care cards. Grant funds will pay for the dinner and the supplies of paper, envelopes, pens, markers, and postage stamps. We will keep the cards on hand in the parish office and send them out in the months ahead.
- 3) We might use grant funds to purchase a new stainless-steel table and sorting station for Brioschi Hall with portable containers for recycling, compost and trash. The new table and station would replace the current wooden countertop near the hall exit doors.
- 4) Other possible uses for grant funds are parish volunteer training, discipleshipfocused book clubs, combining hospitality events with service projects, and other outreach activities.

We can apply to St. Catherine University for another \$ 4000.00 discipleship grant in 2023-24 and 2024-25. The grant funds are a wonderful opportunity to build our relationship with God, our parish community, and address needs in our broader community. If you have ideas for how the grant funds could be used, feel free to write, email, call or chat with me.



THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT



Rejoicing in the Lord

Gracious and loving God, you are the source of all hope, Embed your grace into our hard hearts, and guide us to rejoice on this day. Help us to do your will as we repent of our willful ways. May our deaf ears hear the wisdom of Scripture as we joyfully await the Lord's coming. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sunday, December 11, 2022 Be Strong, Fear Not

Today's readings: Isaiah 35:1–6a; Psalm 146:6–7, 8–9, 9–10; James 5:7–10; Matthew 11:2–11. From the rose vestment the priest may wear, to the depiction of joy in the prayers and readings, the Advent theme of rejoicing permeates the liturgy on the Third Sunday of Advent. The day is called Gaudete Sunday, "gaudete" coming from the Latin word gaudere, "to rejoice." We hear the word rejoice in the entrance antiphon: "Rejoice in the Lord always," and the word joy in the collect, or opening prayer. The reading from Isaiah portrays this joy, telling of the desert and the parched land rejoicing and a time when the eyes of the blind will be opened, the lame will leap, and the mute will sing.

Isaiah predicts salvation and God's victory over sickness and evil. Our "Thanks be to God" after the first reading should be emphatic, because wonderful things await us. Psalm 146 offers praise and hope as it tells how the Lord sets captives free, protects strangers, and thwarts the wicked. At this halfway point in Advent, the Letter of St. James tells us to be patient "until the coming of the Lord."

For your Advent prayer this week, reflect on the reading from St. James, reading it in the morning or before a meal. St. James tells us not to judge another and to look to the prophets as an example of hardship and patience. The Scripture will help you center on the meaning of Advent.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, December 12 Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe

Many people began celebrating la Virgen de Guadalupe nine days ago with a novena. The novena concludes with a vigil Mass at midnight, after an evening of dancing, feasting, and celebrating Mary's appearance and miracles at Tepeyac Hill, Mexico. Mary appeared to the poor to be close to us. Today and during the coming week, find one way to be close to the Blessed Mother. Pray the Magnificat and ask Mary to intercede for people seeking asylum in the United States. Today's readings: Zechariah 2:14–17 or Revelation 11:19a, 12:1–6a, 10ab; Judith 13:18bcde, 19; and Luke 1:26–38 or Luke 1:39–47.

Tuesday, December 13 St. Lucy, Virgin and Martyr

St. Lucy is the patron saint of those who struggle with eye disease, blindness, or impaired sight. Pray today for those who are blind to their neighbor and for others who cannot "see" with eyes of faith and turn away from God. *Today's readings: Zephaniah 3:1–2, 9–13; Psalm 34:2–3, 6–7, 17–18, 19, and 23; Matthew 21:28–32.*

Wednesday, December 14 St. John of the Cross

St. John of the Cross was a Carmelite priest from Spain, known to his followers as a mystic and a poet. In early life he was taught by the Jesuits and the Augustinians, was influenced by the Carthusians, and finally became a spiritual follower of Teresa of Avila. An admirer of Teresa's lifestyle and spirituality, he tried to reform his Carmelite order with her guidance and mentoring. His efforts were misunderstood, though, and he suffered in prison for trying to reform the Carmelites. His "cross" was being treated unjustly. *Today's readings: Isaiah 45:6c–8, 18, 21c–25; Psalm 85:9ab and 10, 11–12, 13–14; Luke 7:18b–23.*

Thursday, December 15 Prepare

Advent is full of joyful events to anticipate and encounter. Not only do we become closer to God through listening to his Word but also through the songs of anticipation, the sweets we eat with thanksgiving, and the nativity scenes enacted. If we are open, the festivities during this time of year can change us, renewing us in hope for a better life and world. Prepare the way of the Lord today, joyfully. *Today's readings: Isaiah 54:1–10; Psalm 30: 2 and 4, 5–6, 11–12a, 13b; Luke 7:24–30.*

Friday, December 16 Beginnings

Today, Simbang Gabi, Las Posadas, and Las Parrandas celebrations begin, anticipating the nativity of Jesus. During Advent support a religious cultural celebration that is different from your experience by attending one of the celebrations. Find the celebrations through your diocesan newspaper or the parish or diocesan website. *Today's readings: Isaiah* 56:1–3a, 6–8; *Psalm* 67:2–3, 5, 7–8; *John* 5:33–36.

Saturday, December 17 "O" Wisdom

As Christmas nears, begin a family evening prayer consisting of the Hail Mary, Our Father, and the "O" antiphon of the day (or sing a different verse of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" daily). Today's antiphon is "O Wisdom, O holy Word of God, / you govern all creation with your strong yet tender care / Come and show your people the way to salvation." Invite your family to reflect on how they will look to God's wisdom during the coming week. *Today's readings: Genesis* 49:2, 8–10; *Psalm* 72:1–2, 3–4ab, 7–8, 17; *Matthew* 1:1–17.
