

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I will be on vacation from January 15-26. While I am gone, there will be no weekday Mass celebrated here except for Wednesday, January 18 and 25, when Father Dave Zimmer will preside at the 9:30 AM School Mass. Father Zimmer grew up in our parish and attended St. Pascal Baylon School, and his family were members of St. Pascal Baylon Church.

On the weekend of January 21-22, Father Bob Karris, O.F.M. will be visiting our parish to preside at the weekend Masses and speak on behalf of Food for the Poor which provides direct relief to the poor throughout Latin America and the Caribbean. Father Karris will share his personal witness about Food For The Poor's mission to care for the destitute as a means of living out the Gospel mandate to love one another. Father Karris was ordained for the Franciscan Order in 1965. Before preaching on behalf of Food For The Poor, he taught at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, was Provincial Minister of his Province, was General Councilor of the Order and was stationed in Rome. He is Professor Emeritus of St. Bonaventure University in New York where he worked for over 16 years. He has published more than fifteen books and continues to write and edit from his home at St. Peter's Catholic Church in the Loop of Chicago. Thank you for welcoming Father Karris.

What is the abbreviation O.F.M.? There are three groups which belong to what is called the first order of St. Francis: the Order of Friars Minor (whose initials are O.F.M.), the Conventual Franciscan Friars (whose initials are O.F.M. Conv.) and the Capuchin Franciscan Friars (whose initials are O.F.M. Cap.). The Franciscans owe their inspiration to Francesco di Bernardone (1181-1226), an affluent young merchant from the Italian town of Assisi, who in 1206 renounced his wealth and social status in favor of a life dedicated to God and the least of God's people. St. Francis of Assisi began his life of penance as a hermit, devoting himself to prayer, working among lepers and rebuilding churches in the Assisi area. Soon others were attracted to his company. By 1209, there were 12 brothers, and they gained approval from Pope Innocent III for their way of life "according to the Holy Gospel." The Order of Lesser Brothers, known in English as the Order of Friars Minor, had begun. (usfranciscans.org)

- **Crafts and Activities:** Colored pencils, fidgets, movies, books, board games, activity kits (e.g. Legos, puzzles)
- **Shelter Supplies:** Twin sheet sets, blankets, pillows

Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism and Confirmation

A fully initiated Catholic is one who has received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. For the vast majority of Catholics, the journey to becoming a fully initiated Catholic was started for them by their parents when they were young and completed years later with the anointing of the Holy Spirit in their confirmation. For adults entering the Church, all three sacraments are celebrated during the Easter Vigil. What do all the symbols of these sacramental rites tell us about the sacrament and what does it mean to live our lives as fully initiated disciples of Jesus? All are welcome to join us for this discussion—Catholics who want a refresher and those curious about the Catholic Church.

Water, Light, and Life: A Lenten Parish Series

Lent is six weeks away, and we're already preparing to offer a parish mission. During the Lenten season, the parish community, along with the whole Church, focuses its attention on the paschal mystery of Christ in a special way. It is a season of conversion and renewal. During these forty days, all members of the community, through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, ready themselves to renew their baptismal promises at the Easter Vigil.
