

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This weekend we welcome Father Bob Karris, O.F.M. to our parish to preside at the weekend Masses and speak on behalf of Food for the Poor which provides direct relief to the poor throughout Latin America and the Caribbean. Father Karris will share his personal witness about Food For The Poor's mission to care for the destitute as a means of living out the Gospel mandate to love one another. Father Karris was ordained for the Franciscan Order in 1965. Before preaching on behalf of Food For The Poor, he taught at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, was Provincial Minister of his Province, was General Councilor of the Order and was stationed in Rome. Father Karris is a Professor Emeritus of St. Bonaventure University in New York where he worked for over 16 years. He has published more than fifteen books and continues to write and edit from his home at St. Peter's Catholic Church in the Loop of Chicago. Thank you for welcoming Father Karris to our parish.

Water, Light, and Life: A Lenten Parish Series

Lent is five weeks away, and we're already preparing to offer a parish mission. During the Lenten season, the parish community, along with the whole Church, focuses its attention on the paschal mystery of Christ in a special way. It is a season of conversion and renewal. During these forty days, all members of the community, through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, ready themselves to renew their baptismal promises at the Easter Vigil.

As a way to enter more deeply into Lent and prepare for Easter, our parish will be offering a four-session Lenten series called Water, Light, and Life. During this series, we will explore Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman and the man born blind, as well as the miracle of raising his friend Lazarus from the dead.
