FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Volunteers needed to help distribute the Blood of Christ at weekend Mass.

Would you be willing to help distribute the Blood of Christ at our weekend Masses? In addition to the people already helping distribute the Body of Christ, we need additional volunteers to help distribute the Blood of Christ. Training will be provided, and you will not have to serve every weekend. This liturgical role is known as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion and more commonly referred to as a Eucharistic Minister.

As I announced at Masses last weekend, I would like us to re-introduce the distribution of the Blood of Christ, in addition to distributing the Body of Christ, starting on Holy Thursday. Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, we offered people the opportunity to receive both the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ at all weekend Masses. I would like us to return to that practice. A couple of teachings from the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) might be helpful:

"...the Catholic faith teaches that Christ, whole and entire, and the true Sacrament, is received even under only one species" (GIRM, 282). In other words, when we receive Holy Communion under the form of consecrated bread or wine, we are receiving Christ, whole and entire.

"Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and clearer expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord, as also the connection between the Eucharistic banquet and the eschatological banquet in the Kingdom of the Father" (GIRM, 281).

Some people may not feel comfortable receiving the Blood of Christ from a common cup because of health concerns. Other people may wish to receive the Blood of Christ, and that point of view is acceptable as well.

"Sacraments of Service: Marriage"
