

# **Archbishop's Dream for Our Parish**

Archbishop Bernard Hebda has a dream for our parish, and every parish in this Archdiocese: a dream in which all Catholics are in a small group. He dreams such things because being in small groups can help our faith come more fully to life and help us draw closer to Jesus. In the earliest days of the Church, small groups spread the good news of Jesus—and they can do it again today.

Did you know? Since January 7 some of your fellow parishioners have been meeting regularly to help make the Archbishop's dream of Catholics in small groups a reality: creating a small group ministry right here at St. Pascal Baylon. If you feel inspired by this or any other aspect of the Archdiocesan Synod process, consider the following action steps:

- (Re)read the Pastoral Letter, "You Will Be My Witnesses," www.archspm.org/synodletter (also available via podcast).
- Prayerfully discern participating in Small Group Leader Formation, a seven-week series held right here at our parish, facilitated virtually by Bishop Joseph Williams, and beginning the week of September 18. There is a Monday morning (10 am 12 Noon) and a Tuesday evening (6:30-8:30 pm) option available. There will be an opportunity to sign up for this series (if you have not already done so) after all Masses the weekend of September 9 & 10, or you may contact Kim Roering in the parish office to learn more or to register. This formation is intended for those who are open to the possibility of playing a leadership role in a small group at St. Pascal's during Lent 2024.
- Small groups will be formed in early 2024. Watch for details and an invitation to come!

Thanks to the generosity of the Men's Club, the `offices, sacristy and chapel now have controlled cooling and heating. Our new system is integrated with the existing online controllers for the Church, Gather Space, and Brioschi Hall. We expect energy savings with this new equipment along with increased flexibility in climate control.

improvements Repairs and breezeway bathrooms because of the flooding this past spring have been completed. New flooring in the girls' room was installed, along with new toilets in both bathrooms. New carpeting in the Old Church and adjacent rooms is finished.

Our summer projects have included the addition of interior and exterior security cameras to our system. Thanks to the Women's Club and Ascension Academy for contributing to this effort.

We've caulked the cement apron at the main church entrance. This will help our freeze/thaw issues and protect the cement from further cracking.

After many bids and a wait for insurance information, our potholes have been patched before the start of school.

The Founders Room ceiling experienced water leakage. Our roofer was out within hours to inspect and repair.

Lighting upgrades and improvements continue. As fluorescent fixtures wear out, we are replacing them with LED.

Our buildings are aging, but we are confident the plan we have in place will meet the needs that arise, both planned and unplanned. Thanks to all of you for your continued support and generosity.
