

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We are sad to announce that Amber Green, our Welcome Desk Receptionist, has resigned from her position here at St. Pascal Baylon Church. Her last day was Monday, January 8. Amber will be pursuing other ventures, and we wish her well. We thank Amber for her service to our community.

I will be on vacation from January 15-25. While I am gone, there will be no weekday Mass celebrated here on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

On Wednesday, January 17 and 24, Father Bob Fitzpatrick will preside at the 9:30 AM School Mass. Parishioners are welcome to join the celebration of the School Mass each week. Father Fitzpatrick is a retired priest of the Archdiocese who enjoys helping at various parishes with Masses and sacramental ministry.

On the weekend of January 20-21, Father Paul Feela will preside here at the Masses while I am on vacation. Father Feela has celebrated weekend Mass here in the past, he helps with Reconciliation liturgies, and he gave a talk here last April on the Eucharist entitled, "Do This in Memory of Me". He was also one of my instructors at the St. Paul Seminary and is an excellent teacher.

We return now to the Season of Ordinary Time in our liturgical cycle. Ordinary Time contains thirty-three or thirty-four weeks. It begins on the Monday following the Sunday after January 6 and continues until the beginning of Lent; it begins again on the Monday after Pentecost Sunday and ends on the Saturday before the First Sunday of Advent. During Ordinary Time, the mystery of Christ itself is honored in its fullness, especially on Sundays. "When we think of the word ordinary, our natural associations are words such as typical, routine, or even mundane. The ordinary in Ordinary Time does not refer to a season of dull routine but rather the listing of ordinal, or sequential, numbers. This is what is meant by the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, etc. There is no First Sunday in Ordinary Time because it is replaced by the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Rather than making a statement about degrees of importance, the term Ordinary Time refers to the order of Sundays in the church year that do not fall into the major liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter. The richness of Ordinary Time is found in the opportunity to know Christ more intimately in the everyday realities of life. The scripture proclaimed in Ordinary Time reveals the teaching and healing and mission of Christ, allowing us to better understand God who became human. Ordinary Time is anything but monotonous. These are the days where we grow into who we are called to be by imitating the lived reality of Jesus." (U.S. Catholic magazine, July 2023)
