

Come join us for the Sacrament of Reconciliation with visiting priests on Tuesday, February 27 at 6:30 PM. This sacrament of God's mercy is a wonderful experience during our Lenten journey.

Congratulations to our high school Confirmation candidates who will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation at the Cathedral of St. Paul this upcoming Saturday, March 2 at 10:00 AM.

At the Parish Pastoral Council meeting on February 6, 2024, the following topics were discussed: Helping Merrick Community Services with some of the monthly cost for providing food at our food distribution on the third Monday of the month; putting on hold the idea of expanding the Donation Closet due to estimated cost; meetings are scheduled in March for Eucharistic Ministers to review procedures for distributing Communion; involvement of Council members at the Welcome Table on Fellowship Weekends and possible outreach to welcome new parishioners. Updates were given by Council liaisons from active parish groups and committees including: report on the Mid-Winter game night on January 26 (Parish Activity Committee), preparing for the Annual Puzzle and Game Exchange on two weekends in February (Women's Club), preparing for Lent Fish Fry dinners (Men's Club), parish small groups will start meeting during Lent (Archdiocesan Synod), and an update on parish finances and facilities. #### We Care Campaign: March 2 & 3

St. Pascal's parish will gather the loose change and bills from the weekend collection and donate them to the Social Justice and Caring Committee's We Care Campaign. The three options chosen by the committee for its winter project are:

#### Option 1: Joseph's Coat

An inner-city free store providing clothes and household items for the poor. This storefront community recognizes the need to supply physical necessities and the importance to increase people's self-worth. Joseph's Coat offers support and encouragement for persons in the midst of conflict, crisis and transition.

#### Option 2: Merrick Community Services Food Distribution Fund

A non-profit agency in Ramsey County that assists individuals and families become self-sufficient. St. Pascal's partners with this agency to run a monthly food distribution ministry at the parish. Money donated to this option will be used to supplement the supplies donated to the parish by Merrick Community Services to ensure that more people can be served by this ministry.

#### **Option 3: 30-Days Foundation**

A Twin-Cities based non-profit organization that provides financial grants (made payable only to the service provider requiring payment) for Minnesota residents. Through this program, residents can get assistance paying for such things as car repairs, rent, medical bills, utility bills etc.

We encourage you to consider making a personal contribution as well, using the envelope provided in the packet of envelopes sent by the parish every other month or found on the tables located near the entrances to the church.

If you prefer to give to one or more of these charities, please indicate this by writing your desired option(s) on the envelope provided in the packet of envelopes sent by the parish or marking the appropriate option(s) on the envelope located on the tables near the entrances to the church and your contributions will be distributed as requested. Any unmarked contributions will be divided equally among the three options. Thank you for your generosity.

### Sunday, February 25, 2024 Continued Change

Today's readings: Genesis 22:1–2, 9a, 10–13, 15–18; Psalm 116:10, 15, 16–17, 18–19; Romans 8:31b–34; Mark 9:2–10. In today's Gospel, Peter, James, and John glimpse Jesus' glory as he is transfigured before them on the mountaintop. Peter, intent on staying at the site of their beatific vision of Jesus, Moses, and Elijah, suggests that three tents be made. "Rabbi, it is good that we are here," he tells Jesus.

Each week we participate in a mystery as we take part in Sunday Mass. There, as the Eucharistic Prayer is prayed, the bread and the wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. But the elements of bread and wine are not all that are transformed during the liturgy. In the Eucharistic Prayer, it is also prayed that we "may become one body, one spirit in Christ." When we are especially attentive to the prayers, songs, and gestures of the liturgy, we may say to ourselves and one another, "It is good that we are here." Transformed by the liturgy, we leave the church to bring the presence of Christ and the Word of God into the world.

Just as the apostles could not stay with Jesus on the mountaintop, the faithful cannot remain in the church. As the Second Vatican Council's *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* states, "The renewal in the eucharist of the covenant between the Lord and his people draws the faithful into the compelling love of Christ and sets them on fire." Our mission, as we leave the liturgy, is to testify to God's love, bringing hope to those facing difficult times. We make Christ known as we accompany others.



### THIS WEEK AT HOME

## Monday, February 26 Forgiven

"Forgive and you will be forgiven," Jesus tells his followers in today's Gospel. As Jesus preaches mercy, he explains that the actions of others will reflect our actions. Only if we are willing to forgive will we be forgiven. During this week, consider whom you need to forgive and from whom you need to request forgiveness. *Today's readings: Daniel 9:4b–10; Psalm 79:8–9, 11, 13; Luke 6:36–38.* 

### Tuesday, February 27 A Just, Humble Life

Both the first reading and the Gospel today give instructions on how to live. In the reading from Isaiah, the Lord instructs "to make justice your aim," aid the orphan and widow, and right wrongs. Jesus tells his followers to live with humility. "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted." When we do good things, we should not seek recognition. Today, strive to forward the kindnesses you have received. That might be done by buying coffee for a coworker, assisting a friend, or doing another's chore. Such acts can be testimonies of God's love. *Today's readings: Isaiah 1:10, 16–20; Psalm 50:8–9, 16bc–17, 21, 23: Matthew 23:1–12.* 

## **Wednesday, February 28**Distractions

Today we are reminded of what we are preparing for: Jesus' passion, death, resurrection, and ascension. During this season we make promises of things we will sacrifice, yet sometimes we become distracted. We are being called to transform our hearts and our lives for the service of our Lord. Today sit with your family and discuss how all can remain attentive to the message of God. What are some of the distractions in your life? How can you overcome them? *Today's readings: Jeremiah 18:18–20; Psalm 31:5–6, 14, 15–16; Matthew 20:17–28.* 

### Thursday, February 29 Making Good Choices

The Gospel from Luke today presents the story of the rich man who ignored the needs of the poor man lying at his door. After death, the poor Lazarus lived in comfort while the rich man was in torment. Our daily choices can lead us to God or away from God. Consider whose needs you ignore while allowing yourself to eat your fill. *Today's readings: Jeremiah 17:5–10; Psalm 1:1–2, 3, 4, 6; Luke 16:19–31.* 

## Friday, March 1 Families

In today's account of Joseph, the youngest son of Jacob, we see an example of jealousy building among brothers until they sell Joseph to foreigners. The eleven brothers appreciated neither their father's preferential treatment of Joseph nor their brother's dreams and wanted to be rid of him. Are there unresolved tensions in your family that are eroding relationships? Examine whether you play a part in the harm or healing in this family dynamic. *Today's readings: Genesis* 37:3–4, 12–13a, 17b–28a; Psalm 105:16–17, 18–19, 20–21; Matthew 21:33–43, 45–46.

## Saturday, March 2 The Love of God

It is no secret the lengths to which God goes to show us his love. We know he wants to be in relationship with us, but sometimes we are reluctant. The moment we say yes to the relationship, God showers us with many blessings. The psalm tells us that God overlooks shortcomings and forgives sins. Today recite the psalm, and with each verse, pause to feel the love and presence of God. *Today's readings: Micah 7:14–15*, 18–20; Psalm 103:1–2, 3–4, 9–10, 11–12; Luke 15:1–3, 11–32.

but there are a few items that are particularly useful to our community. Below are the top five most appropriate items that the community needs in no particular order:

- 1. <u>Cooking oils and kinds of vinegar</u>: such as canola oil, olive oil, chili oil, sesame oil, red or white wine vinegar, rice vinegar, champagne vinegar, butter, Mirin, and any other cooking oils or kinds of vinegar.
- 2. **Spices**: dried chilies of all varieties, cumin, coriander, red pepper flakes, garlic, ginger, turmeric, paprika, rosemary, thyme, cinnamon, curry, cayenne pepper, Cajun seasoning, black pepper, kosher salt, bay leaves, cloves, nutmeg, cardamom, star anise, caraway, fenugreek, allspice, sage, and any other spice.
- 3. <u>Cooking Sauces</u>: Tamari or generic soy sauce, fish sauce, Worcestershire sauce, Tamarind paste, fermented bean pastes, chili pastes, coconut milk, Oyster sauce, Garlic Chili Sauce, Beef broth, Vegetable broth, Chicken broth, Sriracha or any other sauces for cooking.
- 4. <u>Proteins</u>: Peanut butter, Almond butter, cashew butter, spam, tuna, canned chicken, smoked salmon, sardines, smoked eel, or any other shelf-stable proteins.
- 5. <u>Grains</u>: Jasmine rice, basmati rice, apple brand sweet rice, Kokuhu rice, Nishiki rice, artisan egg noodles, rice noodles, Soba noodles, all-purpose flour, rice flour, corn flour, fufu flour, semolina flour, whole wheat flour or any other grains.

Most of these items cannot be ordered from the food banks that are the backbone of the food shelf network, therefore any of these items would be greatly appreciated by the diverse community which Merrick has the privilege to serve.

Any of the items listed above can be placed in St. Pascal's Donation Closet during the month of March. Thank you for your generosity!
