The Two Feet of Social Action

Matthew 25:31-46



Justice is “the moral virtue that consists in the constant and firm will to give their due to God and neighbor” (CCC 1807). Justice prompts us to distribute to God and all people what belongs to them. We walk with the Justice foot by fostering peace and justice and seeking longterm change in local and global communities. We step with this foot when we work to remove the root causes of problems, when we support the efforts persons to transform communities, and when we help change the social structures that contribute to suffering and injustice at home and around the world. Here, we are working to help transform the humanity so that it better reflects the image of Christ.

Charity is a virtue has to do with love for both God and neighbor. Jesus asks “Who is your neighbor?” we know that every person is. Charity calls us to have compassion for our neighbors and those around us who are poor and vulnerable. We step with this foot when we work to aid or assist others both locally and globally to the meet their immediate, short term needs. When we step with the Charitable Works foot, we are imitating Christ’s love through the works of mercy.
