On Wednesday, **February 14, 2018**, **{Ash Wednesday}** we begin the Holy Season of Lent. The season of Lent consists of 40 days of fasting, prayer, and penitence beginning at Ash Wednesday and concluding at sundown on Holy Thursday. Below is information on our Lenten schedules for Confessions, Stations of the Cross, and Holy Week along with our requirements for abstinence and fasting.

The Law of ABSTINENCE. The law of abstinence requires a Catholic 14 years of age until death to abstain from eating meat on Fridays (during Lent) in honor of the Passion of Jesus on Good Friday. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl. Also forbidden are soups or gravies made from them. Salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibians, reptiles and shellfish are permitted, as are animal derived products such as margarine and gelatin which do not have any meat taste.

The Law of FASTING. The law of fasting requires a Catholic from the 18th Birthday (Canon 97) to the 59th Birthday (i.e. the beginning of the 60th year, a year which will be completed on the 60th birthday) to reduce the amount of food eaten from normal. The Church defines this as one meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity. Such fasting is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The fast is broken by eating between meals and by drinks which could be considered food (milk shakes, but not milk). Alcoholic beverages do not break the fast; however, they seem to be contrary to the spirit of doing penance.

FAST and ABSTINENCE: Days of abstinence and fast are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on the Friday (Good Friday) of the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ.
